# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Members,

Time flies! This message denotes more than mid-term of the Council and my presidency. The year of 2019 has been an extra-ordinary year for our architectural profession, in face of the global trade war and social incidents. Our Council however, has been striving to implement our pledges of promoting architectural and professional excellence, while embracing new thinking to tackle the many dynamic challenges during the period.

In my first President's address, I spoke about our Council would aim to explore opportunities both locally and in the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area for our Members, to extend and improve communication channels with our Members, as well as to enhance CPD programmes to put greater emphasis on the complete building cycle including design and project management, and also to enrich Members' knowledge and capability for embracing the use of new technology.

While you will find our efforts in details in the reports of Honorary Secretary Helen as well as Board Chairs, I would like to highlight the key endeavours undertaken by our Council to address the economic turbulence.

Since getting on board, I and my Council Members have been working together on achieving our pledges in Hong Kong, Mainland and overseas arenas. To start with, targeting our young talents and new practices, we managed to either organise, or secure more opportunities for participation in, "real build" design competitions in Hong Kong and in Qianhai. For our Registered Practices and Members, HKIA has been in constant dialogue with the HKSAR government and our Mainland counterparts for enhancing business opportunities in the Greater Bay Area. At the time of delivering this message to you (in August 2020), the coronavirus outbreak is still prevailing. Yet, looking forward, thanks to our Council Members' persistence, a few more "real build" design competitions in Hong Kong organised by the Institute are to be launched shortly. New measures on the qualification requirements for entering the Mainland market for our Members will also be announced very soon and I hope our Members will embrace the opportunities.

In the local market, we have engaged with relevant government departments to strive for quality delivery, which is one of the pledges I made in my first President's address. Progress has been made on the government procurement methods. However, more have to be done to address the fee diving challenge. Our Council will continue our efforts in this regard.

For the Hong Kong society, the Council has organised gatherings with media and legislation councillors on different local issues ranging from urban planning, statutory challenges and matters related to our profession. I also have made good use of media interviews to express HKIA's stance and our professional views on local urban and architectural issues.

## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

On enhancing communication with our Members by making use of new channels, I am pleased that we have conducted regular on-line chats with our Members to introduce our activities and events, and to share issues of concern to Members. The responses have been positive and we have received new initiatives from our Members. The use of on-line technologies has also been extending to our seminars and CPD events.

Talking about enhanced CDP programmes, as a pilot scheme, in 2019, we have waived the registration fee for CPD events held at HKIA Premises to encourage Members' participation. The Council has reviewed the result and would continue with the implementation. Regarding the structure of our CPD events, in my view, balance between technical and design has been achieved to enable our Members to enhance their knowledge of the complete building cycle including design and project management, and to keep abreast of new technologies such as DfMA and BIM. More of these kinds of CPD events will be organised.

Last but not least, the Council has been able to organise both local and overseas exhibitions and conferences throughout the challenging time to continue promote architectural excellence. Both I and Council Members have also attended various international conferences to ensure HKIA stance being recognised and to maintain Hong Kong's visibility in global arena.

Finally, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of my Council Members for their dedicated efforts in striving for the betterment of our architectural profession and to offer my heartfelt thanks to all our HKIA Members for your staunch support for our Institute. May I appeal for all of your continuous support in working for the good of the HKIA in concerted efforts in the last year of my President term!

## BOARD OF PRACTICES

### PRACTICES MATTERS

#### BUILDING INFORMATION MODELLING (BIM)

##### HKIA BIM Accreditation Programme

- HKIA BIM Accreditation Programme for accreditation for listing on the Lists of HKIA BIM Pro and BIM Co was launched on 31 July 2019.
- Submission deadline for grandfathering policy for BIM Pro (HKIA) and BIM Pro will be 31 July 2020 and opened for applications.
- HKIA also discussed CIC on the reciprocal arrangement of HKIA BIM Pro and CIC – Certified BIM Manager and the streamlined procedure for assessment and renewal of BIM Pro (HKIA) / BIM Pro as CIC – Certified BIM Manager.
- Briefing Sessions on HKIA BIM Accreditation Programme was held on 8 August 2019 and 15 August 2019.
- FAQs had posted on HKIA website.
- Top-up training programme was scheduled for launch in around end of 2019.

##### Others

- Construction Industry Council (CIC) gave a briefing to HKIA members on the new BIM Certification and Accreditation Programmes of CIC on 22 February 2019.
- HKIA would co-organize BIM Courses with Hong Kong Design Institute (HKDI) and the Construction Industry Council (CIC).

##### Proposed Security of Payment Legislation (SOPL)

- In response to letter of Development Bureau (DEVB) dated 24 January 2019 seeking views on the refined proposal on scope of adjudication under SOPL, a questionnaire was issued to all registered practices to seek views on the above refined proposal of DEVB on 18 February 2019.
- HKIA, AAP, HKIS and ACQS submitted a joint reply to DEVB in March 2019.
- Regarding HKIA's request to give a briefing to HKIA members on SOPL, DEVB replied that the briefing could be held only when a consensus view on the refined proposal on Extension of Time was reached and the draft legislative framework of the Security of Payment Legislation was finalized.



### CPD RESEARCH FUND

A total of 9 applications for the CPD Research Fund 2019 were received. The Research Fund Vetting Committee composed of BEdA Chair Ms. SO Ching, CPDC Chair Mr. Arthur TONG and Dr. Rosman WAI could not select satisfactory proposal for awarding the fund. BEdA endorsed not to grant the fund to any application this year, and the announcement was released on 29 October 2019.

### Education Development and Accreditation

#### Reviewed HKIA/ARB Accreditation of Architectural Programmes Criteria and Procedures

The Joint ARB/HKIA Taskforce on Being a Canberra Accord Full Signatory has reviewed the Accreditation Handbook to address the comments of the Canberra Accord review team in its last review visit, as well as the collective feedbacks from Visiting Board members. The revised edition was endorsed by the HKIA Council in June 2019.

#### HKIA/ARB Revalidation Visits for CUHK and City U

Applications were received from the schools for conducting revalidation visit for the following programmes:

### 5. Non-Local Architectural Professional Admission (NLAP)

Among the 9 applications received, 4 were accepted, including 1 under Group A and 3 under Group B. One applicant withdrew the application, and the other 4 were rejected due to insufficient practical experience.

### 6. Nominations of Advisers and Office Supervisors

As at deadline on 31 October 2019, a total of 179 nominations were received.

### 7. Taskforce for 10-year Roadmap for PA

The Taskforce set up under the Professional Assessment Committee (PAC) has formed five subgroups to deliberate in detail and formulate recommendations on the following areas for onward planning:

- the minimum threshold or qualifications for PA
- scope, subjects and mode of assessment for Papers 3, 4 and 5
- Case Study, Logbook, Professional Interview and PA Adviser / Office Supervisor System
- enhancement of candidates' learning process through PA by provision of model answer / guidebooks, seminars and workshops
- other related issues, including communication with local universities, succession plan of PAC, etc

To enhance communication between HKIA and tertiary institutions concerning PA and architectural curriculum, a Liaison Group has been formed with membership comprising representatives of BEdA, PAC and each institution offering HKIA/ARB accredited professional architectural programme.

### UIA (International Union of Architects) Education Commission



As a member of the UNESCO-UIA Education Commission, BEdA Chair SO Ching attended the UIA Education Commission meeting held on 18-19 February 2019 in Paris. It was the first time that HKIA took part in this Commission. At the meeting, the members planned ahead the activities for architectural students in the UIA Baku Forum 2019 and Rio 2020 UIA Congress.

#### Strategic Plan

HKIA's participation in UIA is limited due to resources allocation and in ARCASIA as one of the leaders. To nominate HKIA's representatives to participate in different UIA, CAA, ARCASIA sub-committees / work programmes and to attend the overseas events etc.
2. To arrange overseas intern opportunities for our student members.
3. To organize international conference in collaboration with other organizations.
4. To work out long-term strategies with Architectural Society of China regarding the international presence of the HKIA and the ASC with BMA.
5. To proactively explore with Trade Development or Development Bureau on potential opportunities from Mainland in particular under the "One Road One Belt" and "Greater Bay Area" policies for HKIA members as well as Registered Practices with BMA.



## CO-VITALIZE OUR HERITAGE

Co-Vitalize Our Heritage was a public engagement programme organized by the Hong Kong Institute of Architects (HKIA) which spanned 8 months in 2019. Supported by the Built Heritage Conservation Fund (BHCF) under Development Bureau, Co-Vitalize Our Heritage organized over 40 public events in Hong Kong, with architects offering professional insights on over 20 revitalized sites in-person and with participation from over 1,000 members of the public and students.

Through the programme the public can appreciate that conservation and revitalization of built heritage are quests in which they can play a part. We hope through organizing these events we can strengthen awareness of architectural conservation and revitalization in the wider industry and community, while at the same time mobilize young forces to join in, and enhance collaborations among architects, revitalized site operators and other stakeholders.

The programme was composed of 4 main series of events. “Co-Tour with Docents” was guided tours led by architects to explain first-hand the design challenges in adaptive re-use projects and equip docents with relevant knowledge. “Co-Craft with Masters” was hands-on workshops led by architects and master craftsmen where members of the public can learn and try out traditional restoration techniques. Meanwhile secondary school students, led by architects and school teachers, unleashed their imaginations in “Co-Creat with Students” through various media such as drama, short films, art pieces and models. Finally, through the design charrette in “Co-Design with Architects”, community stakeholders joined hands with architects to propose daring adaptive re-use designs for historic buildings.

With events that encouraged collaborative creativity, the success of Co-Vitalize Our Heritage was heavily indebted to the support of stakeholders from each revitalized site as well as the collaboration of our partners, which range from government departments, professional sectors, master craftsmen, secondary schools, community organizations and architects.







# DEED OF CONSTITUTION

WE, THE UNDERSIGNED being met together on the third day of September in the year one thousand nine hundred and fifty-six and being desirous of forming a Society in the Colony of Hong Kong for the general advancement of Civil Architecture and for promoting and facilitating the acquirement of the knowledge of the various Arts and Sciences connected therewith DO HEREBY BAND OURSELVES TOGETHER IN A SOCIETY TO BE KNOWN AS THE HONG KONG SOCIETY OF ARCHITECTS and do undertake as Foundation Members to subscribe to the funds and be bound by the Rules of the Society AND DO FURTHER DECLARE AND AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. that the Society shall consist of Members, Honorary Members, Associates, Graduates and Students;
2. that the Society shall elect and be governed by a Council consisting of a President, two Vice-Presidents, and such other Officers and Members of Council as it may decide;
3. that the Society shall make such Rules for its own good governance and the conduct of its members as it may from time to time think fit;
4. that the Society shall have power in its corporate name to acquire, hold and dispose of property and funds and shall to this end comply with Ordinances of the Government of Hong Kong;
5. that the Society shall invite and have as its Patron a person of eminence in colony.

# HISTORICAL NOTES

## FORMATION

---

On 3<sup>rd</sup> September, 1956, 27 architects gathered and formed a Society “for the general advancement of Civil Architecture and for promoting and facilitating the acquirement of the knowledge of the various Arts and Sciences.” Thus The Hong Kong Society of Architects was formed. On 7<sup>th</sup> May, 1957, the first amendments were made, to stand for over two and a half years. During this period the membership of the Society increased by 50% and recognition as an Allied Society was given by Royal Institute of British Architects. In accord with this growth further amendments were made to come into effect on 3<sup>rd</sup> November, 1959. By the end of 1962, the Society expanded to a membership seven times as large as that first body of foundation members.

The changes of name from Society to the Institute was effected in 1972 after a great deal of preparatory work, and has initiated a new phase of activity in the Institute’s affairs. Members will use the professional affix – Architect HKIA and describe themselves as Member of The Hong Kong Institute of Architects. Associates will describe themselves as Associate of The Hong Kong Institute of Architects in full. No abbreviation of this is permitted.

## PURPOSE

---

The two main purposes of the Institute are to continue to raise both the standard of architecture in Hong Kong and the standard of professional services offered by its members.

## CODE OF PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT

---

In addition to the responsibilities of architects as professionals under law, members of the institute are governed by a Code of Professional Conduct. This Code aims to provide the standard of professional conduct and self-discipline required of the members of the Institute in the interest the general public.

## DISCIPLINE

---

A member whose conduct is found to be in contravention of the Code or dishonouring the principle of the Code is liable to reprimand, suspension or expulsion. This ensures that the public receives from HKIA members only the highest standard of professional service.

## SERVICE TO THE PUBLIC

---

The Institute also serves the public by applying the collective expertise of its members in an advisory role to government and to the building industry. Today, HKIA is represented in numerous consultative or advisory bodies ranging from a working group which counsels the drafting of new building and planning legislation to a committee which formulates standard contracts for use in the building industry.

## HISTORICAL NOTES

### ARCHITECTURAL EDUCATION

---

In the field of education, the Institute works closely with the two Universities, namely, the University of Hong Kong and the Chinese University of Hong Kong and offers courses and counsel in professional practice and practical experience in architecture.

### PROFESSIONAL QUALIFICATION

---

Every year, candidates aspiring to the professional qualification of Architect sit a professional examination held by the Institute. Successful candidates receive recognition not only from professional bodies in Hong Kong but also in UK, Australia, Canada, USA and other countries.

### INTERNATIONAL PARTICIPATION

---

In recent years, the Institute takes Hong Kong to the fore in international circles through its active participation in the International Union of Architects (UIA), the Commonwealth Association of Architects (CAA), and the Architects Regional Council of Asia (ARCASIA).

### ORGANIZATION

---

Today, The Hong Kong Institute of Architects has around 180 Fellows, more than 3,000 Members and over 600 Associates and Graduate Members. The Institute is governed by a Council consisting of a President, two Vice-Presidents, an Honorary Secretary, an Honorary Treasurer, eight Ordinary Members of the Council, the Immediate Past President (ex-officio member) and the Chairmen of the Boards. The Boards, appointed by the Council, are formed to deal with specific areas in the objectives of the Institute. They are the Board of Educational Affairs, Board of External Affairs, Board of Internal Affairs, Board of Local Affairs, Board of Practices and Board of Mainland Affairs. These Boards in turn appoint Committees to deal with matters within the area of responsibility of the Boards.
