



President's Message



President's Message

Dear Members,

The year of 2020 has been a stern challenging year for Hong Kong and the world. Probably none in the community, including the architectural profession, can be spared from the hardship stemming from the COVID-19 pandemic, in terms of physical, social and economic well-being. For Hong Kong, the fact that the pandemic came at the heel of the series of social incidents and global economic turbulence has made the bullet even harder to bite.

Tiding over Challenging Times

Heading the HKIA in such unprecedented stormy times, I and my Council peers have taken it as our obligation to offer timely and practical support to our members. By braving the storm shoulder to shoulder with our members, we have confidence that architects, who are distinctive for our creativity and adaptiveness in our professional works, would stand and overcome the adversity. The prompt actions taken throughout the year for supporting members include liaison with the authorities to fight for extending relief assistance to all of our Registered Practices, including small and medium firm, instead of the government's original plan of only for those on the List of Consultants of AACSB (Architectural and Associated Consultants Selection Board), setting up the subsidy scheme for employing fresh architectural graduates and assistant professionals, earlier release of payment for prolongation claim instead of awaiting for end of contract, accelerating and devising more project opportunities of different scales, streamlining administrative arrangements for plan submission and approval during government department's work-from-home period, etc.

The Institute has also offered concession in membership fee, organised jointly or helped promoting various design competitions to not only promote members' architectural talents, but also create consultancy work opportunities. We also looked beyond Hong Kong to search for, and keep members updated of, the build design competitions of different scales and places, especially those of Mainland China. In this regard, we have created a specific webpage for Mainland news and information, as well as a WeChat platform for facilitating exchanges between our members.

Social Responsibility

HKIA also takes it as our social responsibility in making use of our expertise to help the public fight against COVID-19 and sustain healthy built environment. Our COVID-19 Volunteer Group, consists of more than 60 members of different generations, has outreached to the needy in the community since March 2020. Our actions included helping inspect some elderly centres and schools to offer building health tips, and donating face masks, sanitary pack, supermarket coupons, and computers to under-privileged families. We have also produced a “Healthy Building” Quiz Digital Game to help the public quickly check the condition of their places for improvement of health and level of comfort.

We hope to take reference of COVID-19 to collaborate with other institutes or other professions to work on healthy building education, guidelines, or advocacy for public policy improvement. In 2020, we have jointly organised 9 “Healthy Building Healthy City” webinars for our members and the public. Such joint endeavours have paved way for the upcoming “Healthy City Initiatives” with partner-organisations in construction, education, and medical fields. We hope our professional input can help turn Hong Kong into a liveable city and healthier community in the long run.

Educational Fronts

Education is one of HKIA’s major function for nurturing young architects, safeguarding standards, and enhancing the profession in pursuit for excellence.

Being affected by the pandemic, the schedule of some of our Professional Assessment (PA) sessions had been deferred to latter half of the year. Yet, thankfully, all PA papers eventually proceeded smoothly.

The accreditation for the programmes of The Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK) and City University of Hong Kong (CityU) were also deferred to December of 2020. I am glad that both HKIA Council and ARB have endorsed the visiting board reports granting unconditional recognition for five years for the Master and Bachelor programmes of CUHK, as well as Bachelor programme of CityU in architectural studies.

My heartfelt gratitude to the local and overseas visiting board members and observers, the many assessors and script markers who supported the PA throughout the year, as well as the many Office Supervisors and Advisers who offered individual guidance for PA candidates. They have played crucial roles in nurturing generations of young architects. My sincere thanks also go to the dedicated members of the Professional Assessment Committee and its various Paper Panels. Throughout 2020, they have worked on streamlining the PA process, producing Study Guides for PA candidates, and would continue to work on the future decade’s roadmap for bettering the PA system.

In my first speech as President-elect, I pledged to enhance our members' knowledge of full building cycle by taking lifelong learning as our duties for coping with the technological enhancement and ever changing social demands. In 2020, HKIA's different Boards have conducted altogether about 50 Continuing Professional Development (CPD) events. These comprised thematic series such as under the themes of Becoming Authorised Person, Healthy Building Healthy City, HKIA Annual Award winning projects, technology applications, etc. HKIA has also collaborated with local and international professional organisations from time to time to enrich our CPD events, so that our members can gain from a wider pool of speakers, topics and perspectives.

To build up our members' capabilities in adopting BIM in building projects for coping with the increasing demand, and to offer them qualifications of BIM Team Leader and BIM Coordinator, throughout 2020, HKIA has been developing in full gear the HKIA BIM Pro and BIM Co Accreditation Programme which was launched in mid-2019. A series of training, top-up programmes and CPD events in this regard have also been organised.

Impacted by the epidemic, many CPD events were postponed to latter half of the year, with most having converted to online format. It turned out that the attendances of these online events were much higher than the conventional onsite seminars. While future seminars may likely be conducted onsite-cum-online even after the pandemic, we do hope that more in-person site visits, rather than virtual ones, can be conducted soon. In 2020, unfortunately, we only managed to organise one site visit in January before the spread of pandemic.

Connection with Mainland and Overseas

Due to the global COVID-19 outbreak, many working meetings, events and conferences of our partnering organisations in the Mainland or overseas were postponed, or changed to online format. That have not deterred our members from actively participating as representatives or speakers in the various platforms, such as Architects Regional Council Asia (ARCASIA), International Union of Architects (UIA), Canberra Accord, Commonwealth Association of Architects (CAA), as well as the events organised by Mainland and Hong Kong authorities regarding practicing in Qianhai, Greater Bay Area and Belt and Road Region.

Besides maintaining our connection and exchange with our counterparts in the world, our participation can also help ensure HKIA, Hong Kong professionals, and our architectural excellence being visible in the global arena.

Architectural Excellence

In 2020, we celebrated the 55-year history of the renowned HKIA Annual Awards, with 10 projects being awarded this year. Adding to our eminent Young Architect Award set up in 2012, in 2020, we launched the HKIA Gold Medal – the most prestigious honour for recognising individuals with consistent, profound and demonstrated contribution to Hong Kong architecture. The inaugural award goes to Mr James Hajime KINOSHITA – a guru well-deserved for this acclaim.

Architecture awards, exhibitions and competitions have long been the effective means for displaying the talents and excellence of our profession. Despite not being able to go overseas for various regional and international events, throughout 2020, we have striven to either run the events online, such as the collateral seminar series and virtual exhibition for the Venice Biennale International Architecture Exhibition (VB 2021); or stage local response exhibitions, such as for our Los Angeles Architecture Exhibition, HKIA Cross-Strait Architectural Design Symposium and Awards (CADSA), Bi-City Biennale of Urbanism\Architecture (UABBHK), etc.



Practices Matters

Building Information Modelling (BIM)

HKIA BIM Accreditation Programme

- HKIA BIM Accreditation Programme for accreditation for listing on the Lists of HKIA BIM Pro and BIM Co was launched on 31 July 2019.
- The submission deadline for grandfathering policy for BIM Pro (HKIA) and BIM Pro was 31 July 2020 and opened for applications.
- HKIA also discussed with CIC on the reciprocal arrangement of HKIA BIM Pro and CIC – Certified BIM Manager and the streamlined procedure for assessment and renewal of BIM Pro (HKIA) / BIM Pro as CIC – Certified BIM Manager.
- FAQs had posted on HKIA website.
- The 1st round of BIM Pro Training Programme conducted in Cantonese on Zoom was held on 18 and 25 July 2020.
- The 2nd round of BIM Pro Training Programme conducted in English on Zoom was held on 24 & 31 October and 7 November 2020.

Anti-epidemic fund supporting the construction Industry in combating the novel Coronavirus from Development Bureau

- Development Bureau (DevB) wrote to HKIA on 24 February 2020 that the Government would provide a one-off subsidy in the amount of HK\$50,000 under the Anti-epidemic Fund for all architectural firms in the AACSB List of Consultants to apply.
- HKIA replied to DevB on 2 March 2020 that about 130 of our Registered Practices (RPs) in the Institute including those under the List of Band 3 Architectural Consultants had not yet been taken care of in this Fund. We urged DevB to consider to include all of our Registered Practices into her supporting list so that they were eligible to apply for the Fund.
- HKIA issued a letter to Development Bureau (DevB) and had the subsequent meeting with DevB and the representatives from Architectural Services Department (ArchSD), Buildings Department (BD), Lands Department (LD) & the Construction Industry Council (CIC) on 5 March 2020, through the coordination by Hon. Tony TSE. DevB

replied to HKIA dated 6 Apr 2020 that the coverage of the Anti-epidemic Fund had been extended to all of HKIA RPs including small and medium firms in addition to those under the Architectural and Associated Consultants Selection Board (AACSB) list in the first-round funding. Eligible firms would be granted an amount of HK\$20,000.

Contract Dispute Resolution (CDRC)

- Contract Dispute Resolution Committee is working on a New Standard Form of Contract for Minor Works, Fitting Out, Renovation Alteration and Addition Works Project since November 2020, and targeted to complete it by the end of December 2021.
- The Committee is also working on a new Contract Dispute Resolution Handbook and target to complete in 2021.



Renewal of mutual recognition agreement with Architects Accreditation Council of Australia (AACCA)

The mutual recognition agreement with AACCA was renewed on 24 December 2020 and would be valid for 5 years until 2025.

Canberra Accord Interim Meeting 2020

HKIA Board of Educational Affairs Chair So Ching and ARB Education and Accreditation Committee ex-Chair Dr. Rosman Wai attended the Canberra Accord Interim Meeting on 16 and 18 September 2020.

Transitional arrangement for accepting UK architectural education qualifications for taking HKIA/ARB Professional Assessment (PA)

For admission as a HKIA Member and a Registered Architect in Hong Kong, one needs to sit for the PA jointly organised by HKIA and ARB. To be eligible for the PA, an applicant must attain an appropriate architectural educational qualification and with a minimum of 2 years practical experience and training. Architectural educational qualifications recognised by HKIA/ARB include :

- (a) Local professional architectural programmes directly accredited by HKIA/ARB;
- (b) Non-local professional architectural programmes currently accredited by one of the following national bodies, in their respective countries:
 - National Board of Architectural Accreditation (NBAA) of People's Republic of China
 - National Architectural Accrediting Board of USA (NAAB)
 - Architects Accreditation Council of Australia (AACCA)
 - New Zealand Registered Architects Board (NZRAB)
- (c) Professional architectural programmes recognised by the Commonwealth Association of Architects (CAA)

Starting 1 February 2020, CAA revised the list of qualifications recommended for recognition to include architectural programmes validated directly by CAA validation panel only, while those architectural programmes recognised by national validation procedures (i.e. United Kingdom, New Zealand and Australia) have been removed from the list.

As HKIA currently has mutual recognition arrangement with AACA and NZRAB, the professional architectural programmes in Australia and New Zealand accredited by AACA and NZRAB will continue to be recognised by HKIA/ARB for taking the PA.

With the updated CAA list, and since HKIA/ARB have no mutual recognition arrangement for academic credentials with the UK authority, there is a transitional arrangement for accepting UK architectural education qualifications for taking PA.

- Students who commence the architectural programmes in UK in the academic year of 2021/2022 or before would be regarded as having fulfilled the required educational qualifications for PA provided that the programmes are on the 2019 list of CAA.






International Union of Architects (“UIA”)

Honorary Secretary's Report

COVID-19 Volunteer Group

In response to the COVID-19 outbreak in the Community, the Institute formed a volunteer group (VG) to explore ways to assist the public to work against the epidemic spread and to gather forces from all fronts to promote Healthy City Healthy Building for Hong Kong. In view of the global COVID-19 pandemic, the 17th Venice Biennale International Architecture Exhibition was postponed to May 2021.








A model of the exhibition venue design.







Deed of Constitution

WE, THE UNDERSIGNED being met together on the third day of September in the year one thousand nine hundred and fifty-six and being desirous of forming a Society in the Colony of Hong Kong for the general advancement of Civil Architecture and for promoting and facilitating the acquirement of the knowledge of the various Arts and Sciences connected therewith DO HEREBY BAND OURSELVES TOGETHER IN A SOCIETY TO BE KNOWN AS THE HONG KONG SOCIETY OF ARCHITECTS and do undertake as Foundation Members to subscribe to the funds and be bound by the Rules of the Society AND DO FURTHER DECLARE AND AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. that the Society shall consist of Members, Honorary Members, Associates, Graduates and Students;
2. that the Society shall elect and be governed by a Council consisting of a President, two Vice-Presidents, and such other Officers and Members of Council as it may decide;
3. that the Society shall make such Rules for its own good governance and the conduct of its members as it may from time to time think fit;
4. that the Society shall have power in its corporate name to acquire, hold and dispose of property and funds and shall to this end comply with Ordinances of the Government of Hong Kong;
5. that the Society shall invite and have as its Patron a person of eminence in colony.

Historical Notes

Formation

On 3rd September, 1956, 27 architects gathered and formed a Society “for the general advancement of Civil Architecture and for promoting and facilitating the acquirement of the knowledge of the various Arts and Sciences.” Thus The Hong Kong Society of Architects was formed. On 7th May, 1957, the first amendments were made, to stand for over two and a half years. During this period the membership of the Society increased by 50% and recognition as an Allied Society was given by Royal Institute of British Architects. In accord with this growth further amendments were made to come into effect on 3rd November, 1959. By the end of 1962, the Society expanded to a membership seven times as large as that first body of foundation members. The changes of name from Society to the Institute was effected in 1972 after a great deal of preparatory work, and has initiated a new phase of activity in the Institute’s affairs. Members will use the professional affix – Architect HKIA and describe themselves as Member of The Hong Kong Institute of Architects. Associates will describe themselves as Associate of The Hong Kong Institute of Architects in full. No abbreviation of this is permitted.

Purpose

The two main purposes of the Institute are to continue to raise both the standard of architecture in Hong Kong and the standard of professional services offered by its members.

Code of Professional Conduct

In addition to the responsibilities of architects as professionals under law, members of the institute are governed by a Code of Professional Conduct. This Code aims to provide the standard of professional conduct and self-discipline required of the members of the Institute in the interest the general public.

Discipline

A member whose conduct is found to be in contravention of the Code or dishonouring the principle of the Code is liable to reprimand, suspension or expulsion. This ensures that the public receives from HKIA members only the highest standard of professional service.

Service To The Public

The Institute also serves the public by applying the collective expertise of its members in an advisory role to government and to the building industry. Today, HKIA is represented in numerous consultative or advisory bodies ranging from a working group which counsels the

drafting of new building and planning legislation to a committee which formulates standard contracts for use in the building industry.

Architectural Education

In the field of education, the Institute works closely with the two Universities, namely, the University of Hong Kong and the Chinese University of Hong Kong and offers courses and counsel in professional practice and practical experience in architecture.

Professional Qualification

Every year, candidates aspiring to the professional qualification of Architect sit a professional examination held by the Institute. Successful candidates receive recognition not only from professional bodies in Hong Kong but also in UK, Australia, Canada, USA and other countries.

International Participation

In recent years, the Institute takes Hong Kong to the fore in international circles through its active participation in the International Union of Architects (UIA), the Commonwealth Association of Architects (CAA), and the Architects Regional Council of Asia (ARCASIA).

Organization

Today, The Hong Kong Institute of Architects has around 180 Fellows, more than 3,000 Members and over 600 Associates and Graduate Members. The Institute is governed by a Council

consisting of a President, two Vice-Presidents, an Honorary Secretary, an Honorary Treasurer, eight Ordinary Members of the Council, the Immediate Past President (ex-officio member) and the Chairmen of the Boards. The Boards, appointed by the Council, are formed to deal with specific areas in the objectives of the Institute. They are the Board of Educational Affairs, Board of External Affairs, Board of Internal Affairs, Board of Local Affairs, Board of Practices and Board of Mainland Affairs. These Boards in turn appoint Committees to deal with matters within the area of responsibility of the Boards.
