PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Members,

The year of 2023 started with the gradual calming down of the COVID saga. After enduring over 3 years of anti-pandemic restrictions, we cannot wait to meet each other face-to-face in a physical mask-off setting. 2023 started with an architectural hiking tour to Lantau Mountain Camps, followed by the Spring Reception cum housewarming party of the recently renovated HKIA premises, and meeting with Government officials and other professional institutes and public on important industry issues, including SOPL, KYC Artificial Island and manpower shortage in the rest of 2023.

RESUMPTION OF HKIA ANNUAL BALL

The climax was the HKIA Annual Ball cum Annual Award Presentation Ceremony 2023 held on 8 November, after suspension for 3 years due to Covid. It attracted some 700 participants, including senior government officials, members, friends from other professional institutes, students and other guests. The recipient of 2023 HKIA Gold Medal, Ar Donald Liao Poon Huai, as well as the HKIA Annual Awards 2022- 23 winners were formally announced under the witness of Guest of Honour Deputy Financial Secretary Michael Wong and other guests and members. One Medal of The Year, 10 HKIA Awards, 3 President's Special Prizes, as well as many merits, finalists and special awards were presented in recognition of the efforts of our members in striving towards architectural excellence, not only inside HK, but also in Mainland China and other parts of the world like Japan.

A highlight of the Annual Ball was the musical performance under the theme of the HKIA Annual Ball 2023 "Architectur-ing the Future", to capture both our profession's and our city's forward-thinking spirit and dynamic culture. It was composed, performed with video effects based on the artistic creation of our fellow architects, a demonstration of the other sides of creativity of architects.

The relaxation of the quarantine procedures and cross-border restrictions also enabled us to resume our active academic and professional interchanges with our counterparts in Mainland and overseas, to strengthen our global connections.

GLOBAL CONNECTIONS

Connection with Mainland

In the first quarter of this year, we have already organized two study tours to visit the UABB exhibitions and other architectures in Shenzhen, as well as a visit to the National Archives of Publications and Culture in Hangzhou (杭州版本館). I have also attended a roundtable meeting organized by Shenzhen Registered Architects Association in Guangzhou, and joined CIC's delegation to the International Intelligent Construction Industry Innovation Conference in Chongqing.

The momentum was kept the whole year, including a two-day mission to Guangzhou Nansha, and a CPD visit to Shanghai Panlong Tiandi (走進公園裏的新天地:上海蟠龍天地) in May. I joined the National Day Delegation from the engineering, construction and surveying sectors to Beijing in September, the Third Belt and Road Forum for International Cooperation held in Beijing, the grand opening for HKIA's Nanjing Exhibition, and meeting with Nanjing University, Southeast University and Hangzhou Exploration & Design Industry Association Hangzhou Exchange in October 2023. In November, I attended the inauguration ceremony of 港澳发展联会(联动分会) organized by Guangzhou Exploration & Design Association (广州市工程勘察设计行业协会), and the 2023 Qianhai Global Investment Promotion and Talent Conference organized by the Qianhai Authority (前海管理局) and held at Qianhai International Convention Centre on 8 November 2023.

On the other hand, we received many official mainland delegations to HK, including Nanhai in Foshan, Tianhe in Guangzhou, and attended a few seminars organized by Qianhai Authority in Hong Kong, and a promotional seminar by Hainan in first Quarter. In the 2nd Quarter, we received more Mainland delegations and participated in more seminars and conferences, including an exchange session with Department of Housing and Urban-Rural Development (廣東省住房和城鄉建設廳). I also attended the Belt and Road Global Forum Annual Roundtable organized by HKTDC in September. We signed a few MOU with Mainland counterparts in 2023.

International Connections

Being an important professional institute of an international metropolitan, international connections are very important for HKIA, but it was under serious restrictions during the Covid period. The Board of External Affairs and Board of Education quickly took full advantage of the post Covid period to resume our active international academic and professional interchanges.

Canberra Accord

With Dr Rosman Wai as the first HKIA member elected as the Chair of the Canberra Accord in 2021 to 23, the Canberra Accord General Meeting 2023 was held on 15-17 June in Hong Kong. Altogether 23 delegates from 7 signatory regions came to Hong Kong while 8 delegates joined the meeting via Zoom. Tours were arranged for the international delegates after the meeting.

UIA Copenhagen Congress and Assembly

In July, I led the HKIA delegation to UIA Copenhagen Congress and Assembly, consisting of 29 HKIA delegates attended the 9-day event, with 19 papers presented, 15 members' works exhibited, 29 seminars/conferences/workshops participated, and 8 site visits joined.

ARCASIA 20th Asian Congress of Architects (ACA 20)

Hon Sec Thomas attended in person ARCASIA Committee's Roundtable meeting held in Kathmandu of Nepal in January and then ARCASIA OB-Committee Chairs meeting in Boracay of the Philippines in February. ARCASIA Fellowship organized an online Remembrance event on 19 March to pay tribute to the passing of Ronald Poon (our Past President) and Mubasshar Hussain, both Past Chairs of ARCASIA. Past HKIA Presidents Anna Kwong and Edward Shen, HKIA members Joseph Kwan and Tony Tang shared in the event.

BEa Chair Sunnie Lau spoke at the ARCASIA Asian Young Architects Webinar Series Sustainable Architecture #2 with the theme of "Wonder Woman Architects' Point of View" on 20 May.

In September, I led the HKIA delegation to ARCASIA 20th Asian Congress of Architects (ACA 20) held in Manila, consisting of 15 HKIA delegates, with 2 papers presented by HKIA members at the Congress. On that occasion, Hon Sec Thomas Cheung was elected as the ARCASIA Zone C Vice President 2024-25.

59th Venice Biennale

The 59th Venice Biennale was held in 2022, and the opening of the Venice – Hong Kong Exhibitions (theme: Transformative Hong Kong, The Laboratory of the Future) took place on 19 May 2023. The Guests of Honour were Kenneth Fok, Chairman of HK Arts Development Council, and Victor Tsang, Head of CreateHK. The exhibition lasted until November.

Mutual recognition of academic qualifications with ARBUK

The discussion with the Architects Registration Board of United Kingdom (ARBUK) on potential bilateral recognition of academic qualifications since RIBA left Commonwealth Architects Association in 2021 is near the end. Most of the issues have been resolved, and hopefully a MOU would be signed in 2024. Meanwhile, the transitional arrangement of recognizing UK architectural programmes for Hong Kong students has been extended.

HKIA Roving Architecture Exhibitions (RAX)

With the funding support of CreateHK, we organized a Kuala Lumpur – Nanjing Exhibitions Roving Architecture Exhibitions this year, with the theme of "Harmony in Diversity – Connecting the Metropolis by In-Betweens" in July and October respectively. The response exhibition in Hong Kong will be held in the first quarter of next year.

ISSUES OF CONCERNS

Specific task forces

Owing to the importance of some major issues, we have established specific task forces under the Board of Practices and Board of Local Affairs to tackle the Northern Metropolis development, the Kau Yi Chau Artificial Islands development, Carbon Neutrality, Streamlining of Government Procedures, Design for Safety, Unfair Contract Terms, Security of Payment Legislation, and Fee Diving. These are all critical issues affecting our practices and the architecture profession. The task forces consolidated views from members, discuss with relevant authorities and prepare submissions to the Government and reported in other sessions of this report.

Manpower Shortage

While we have over 4000 professional members, and the number is increasing steadily with over 190 new members passing the Professional Assessment in 2023, acute shortage of Architects is projected by CIC in view of the upcoming major infrastructure and housing projects in Hong Kong.

In our submission to the Financial Secretary on the government budget and many other occasions, we pointed out the need to streamline Government procedures to release the productivity of architects in Hong Kong, resolving the fee-diving problem to create a healthy ecosystem, as well as improving the liveability of HK through good architectural and urban design so as to attract architects, especially the younger ones, to remain in the profession and stay in Hong Kong. It is also necessary to expand Government subsidized professional architectural programmes to nurture more young talents.

While HKIA has already validated 4 architectural master degree programmes in Hong Kong, we have issued a supporting letter to CityU on the setting up of a new Master of Architecture programme. Hopefully, we will have one more local MArch programme, providing more opportunities to passionate youths in Hong Kong.

Streamlining of Government Procedures

We have established a special task force consisting of over 10 experienced APs, to look into the problems of streamlining Government procedures. After months of hard work, we submitted a detailed proposal to the Development Bureau (DEVB) in April, which contains 8 pages of solid suggestions on streamlining statutory approval procedures, and a meeting with DEVB and the Fire Services Department to exchange on potential areas for simplification was arranged on 28 August 2023.

Measures for Resolving Fee-Diving

HKIA has warned the Government over the years the detrimental effects of fee-diving to the healthy development of our professional environment, which is highly unfavourable to attract talent, especially young architects, to come and stay in Hong Kong and in the profession. A detailed and solid proposal on resolving fee-diving was submitted to the Government on 3 July 2023. A meeting to discuss the subject with the DEVB was arranged on 31 July 2023.

We are glad that the Government adopted some improvement measures on procurement of architectural consultancy last year. HKIA will further liaise with DEVB on this issue in 2024.

Security of Payment Legislation (SOPL)

We also expressed our grave concerns on the adverse effects of SOPL to our professionalism and submitted a joint letter with other professional institutes (HKIA, AAP, ACQS and AREC to DEVB) to DEVB on 27 July. Unfortunately, in Government's reply on 7 August, none of our proposals was adopted, except for the promise of exploring the policy framework on direct engagement of sub-consultants.

We made a submission to DEVB again on 22 November, and the Development Panel of LegCo on 28 November respectively to explain our concerns.

Design for Safety Legislation

As to the upcoming Design for Safety legislations and other regulatory issues that might affect our members and the industry, we have tried our very best to make use of various opportunities to reflect our members' views to the responsible authorities, either proactively approaching government officials or taking advantage of external events.

Buildings Department Public Seminar on Illegal Alteration

I and Adrian Lo served as speakers in a 11 July public seminar organized by BD on educating the public on prevention of illegal alteration, and the need for engagement of architects and authorised persons on alteration works. Hon Treasurer Allen POON also participated in the production of a related video in August.

Housing Bureau's Briefing on Private Subsidized Sale Flat Pilot Scheme (樂建居)

On 13 July 2023, HKIA attended a briefing organized by Housing Bureau on Private Subsidized Sale Flat Pilot Scheme which HKIA supports.

Northern Metropolis

A joint institute two-day forum and workshop on Northern Metropolis was organized on 24-25 June, with speakers from HKIA, HKIE, HKIS, HKIP, HKILA, HKICON, The Conservancy Association, Liber Research Community and WWF. Some 50+ people joined the workshop in person and over 200 online. HKIA also attended many DEVB public engagement sessions in 2023. Other than submission of HKIA's Views to Government in August. A Joint Institute Statement on San Tin Technopole by HKIA together with HKICON, HKIE, HKIS, HKILA, HKIP and HKIUD was released to the media at a joint press conference organized by HKIA at our premises on 9 August.

After the issue of Policy Address in November, we organized the Future City Vision - Northern Metropolis Forum 2.0 on 18 & 25 November 2023 at HKIA Premises again, recording 140 participants in person and 170 by Zoom. Report on the Forum was also submitted to Government.

2023 Policy Address – Public Engagement

On behalf of HKIA and in other capacities, I myself, the Vice Presidents and other Council Members attended many policy address public engagement sessions to reflect members' views. A Members' Forum on Policy Address was held on 29 August to collect members' views on the subject. Consolidating ideas and suggestions from our Boards and Committees as well as views gathered at the Forum, our suggestions on the Policy Address was submitted to the Government on 30 August.

We issued the HKIA Response to Policy Address 2023 on 3 November 2023. While the Policy Address responded to some of our recommendations contained in our August submission, we further shared our views on some important issues.

Voice of Members

The 2023-24 Council continues the previous Council's arrangement of engaging registered practices via breakfast meetings. Views collected would be reflected to senior Government Officials at external events and private meetings so as to get our members' voice heard.

To better collect members' views and understand their needs, launched a structured and revamped member survey questionnaire. The response rate was very good, and the result is being analysed, which would be shared with members and used to back up our views to Government on issues that affect our professional environment.

On 13 April, HKIA Council and some Task Force Chairs hosted a media lunch with over 10 media to kick start our outreach to the media. HKIA's views on KYCAI, Northern Metropolis, acute manpower shortage, amendments to harbour protection ordinance, URA Yaumatei Mongkok study and a few other major issues were presented to the press, which were subsequently reported on TV news channels and newspapers.

The newly formed Media & Communication Committee is tasked with strengthening HKIA's presence in social media (Facebook and Instagram), enhancing our website, and better projecting the HKIA brand in the public eyes.

Promoting Architectural Excellence

HKIA Gold Medal 2023 & Young Architect Awards 2022

The HKIA Gold Medal 2022 is the most prestigious HKIA honour to recognize the life-time achievement of members who have made consistent, profound and distinguished contributions to Hong Kong's architecture, while the Young Architect Awards 2022 aims to honour and acknowledge the talents and contribution of up-coming young HKIA members (aged 35 or below). The recipients were announced at the Annual Dinner in November.

HKIA Annual Awards 2022-23

After a full review to embrace recent trends and expanding agenda of architecture and to provide a more honourable and fairer judging system for participants, more categories have been added to the HKIA Annual Awards 2022-23, resulting in more awards given to recognize the diversified achievements of members.

I chaired the Jury Panel of HKIA Annual Award 2022-23, and the Jury adjudication was held in September 2023. The results were announced at HKIA Annual Ball 2023 held on 8 November. There were 1 Medal of the Year, 11 HKIA Awards, 17 Merits, 3 President's Special Prizes, 12 Special Awards and 20 Finalists.

SUCCESSION OF HKIA

One of the most encouraging events in 2023 was the New Members Certificate Presentation Ceremony on 15 July 2023, with the participation of our 149 new members and more than 250 family members. We saw a bright future of HKIA from the cheerful new faces!

We encourage our young members to join our committee, including Sports Teams and Music Group. Actually, a number of our major events are led by young members, such as the publication of our Journal, Annual Awards and Annual Dinner, not to mention the Young Architect Award. They are also encouraged to participate in the policy advisory process, e.g. joining the Government's briefing session on Kau Yi Chau Artificial Islands (KYCAI) proposal. Activities were also arranged to engage HK students studying architecture in Mainland, so that they could be well-prepared for becoming professional architects in HK after graduation.

Architects work hard and play hard. HKIA sports teams have remarkable performance in the inter-institute matches. One example is our Volleyball Team. They have won the Male Champion and the Female First Runner-up of the RSCP Volleyball Tournament 2023 in December! We are proud of them!

Board of Practices (BP)

Update on Security of Payment Legislation (SOPL) Bill

DEVB proposed a two-stage implementation of SOPL, with binding adjudicator decisions. HKIA raised concerns and consulted members before responding. A formal taskforce meeting was scheduled for late Mar 2023. Concerns about the draft Bill amendments were deliberated at the taskforce meeting.

A joint letter from AAP, ACQS, AREC, and HKIA was submitted to DEVB, stating that support for the Bill depends on addressing these concerns. The joint letter reiterating concerns was submitted on 24 Apr 2023, maintaining that support for the draft Bill is conditional. HKIA submitted another letter on 27 Jul 2023 indicating the Institute cannot support the Adjusted Proposal.

A second joint letter expressing concerns was submitted to DEVB on 27 Jul 2023. DEVB's August reiterated their previous response. HKIA engaged a legal consultant Mayer Brown to address the adjudication scope and prerequisites, the revised letter was sent to the SDEV on 22 Nov 2023.

Communication Meeting with DEVB, ArchSD and AAP

The 36th Communication Meeting with DEVB, ArchSD and AAP was held on 8 Dec 2022. President Ar. Benny CHAN, VP Ar. Bryant, VP Ar. Julia LAU, HS Ar. Thomas CHEUNG, BP Chair Ar. Albert CHAN attended the Meeting.

Small Practice Committee

The new Committee supports professional and business development, growth for the members of Registered Practices in ArchSD's Band 3 List, and of small-scale Registered Practices of not more than 20 nos. total staff.

The committee aims to support their professional development, elevate awareness of their works, and to celebrate their contributions to the built environment and to promote our Registered Practices to cope with the emerging needs for "non-traditional" professional services in the market, such as community engagement, exhibition curation, architectural research, etc.

BD Workshop on Buildings Department's GBP Calculators

The workshop took place on 21 Dec 2023 with an attendance of 36 members in person and 167 members via Zooms.



Exchange Session with BD

BD organised an Exchange Workshop with young architects on 25 Aug 2023, with project demonstration and group discussion. 14 of the 35 representatives are from the RPs.



Engagement with Band 1, Band 2 and Band 3 Registered Practices(RPs)

To improve communication between architectural consultants and the institute, as well as gathering their feedback on recent government proposals and the challenges they face, breakfast meetings with Band 1 and Bands 2 & 3 RPs were held on 20 Mar, 24 Apr, 11 Sep and 16 Oct 2023 respectively.



CPD Research Fund

7 applications for the CPD Research Fund were received.

A Research Fund Vetting Committee consisting of LAU Sing Yeung Sunnie, and WONG Po Lung John were appointed by the BEdA to vet the submissions.

With endorsement by the Council, the following applications were granted the CPD Research Fund 2023:

- Applicant: Ar. MA Chang Ling
Research topic: Pixelated Histories: Revealing the Hidden Stories from Islands in Hong Kong

- Applicant: Ar. CHAN Ming Tat Cyrus
Research topic: Playspace Design Framework under Dense Urban Condition in Hong Kong

Each of the awarded applications will receive HK\$50,000 with 50% funding granted upon successful application and the other 50% funding granted upon completion of research and final approval by BEdA. Awardees were required to complete the research within 12 months, unless with prior approval by BEdA.

Education Development and Accreditation

Canberra Accord

HKIA has become a full signatory of Canberra Accord (CA) in 2018, Academic Qualification Review (AQR) was established to provide a simpler route to allow graduates from architectural programmes accredited by Canberra Accord signatories to apply for Professional Assessment. Since 2023 October, candidates who have obtained academic qualifications recognized by Canberra Accord are no longer required to go through AQR, can may register for Professional Assessment directly without the need for additional assessment.

Canberra Accord Interim Meeting 2023

As an obligation of a full signatory, HKIA hosted the Canberra Accord General Meeting from 15 to 16 June 2023 at the West Kowloon Xiqu Centre. The meeting was attended by 23 in-person representatives from Canberra Accord signatory organisations, along with 8 participants who joined online.

Transitional Arrangement of Recognising UK Architectural Educational Qualifications as Meeting Eligibility Requirement for Taking Professional Assessment in Hong Kong

Since 2020, the Commonwealth Institute of Architects (CAA) has removed the United Kingdom from the list of recognised programmes, HKIA and ARB started liaising with the Architects Registration Board (ARB UK) on a mutual recognition agreement. Before reaching an agreement, for the sake of students, HKIA/ARB decided to adopt special transitional measures to recognise British architectural education qualifications for their graduates to participate in HKIA/ARB professional assessment. This measure has been extended to candidates enrolled in UK architecture programmes in the 2023/24 academic year, and graduates will be deemed to meet the educational qualifications required to take HKIA/ARB Professional Assessment.





HKIA Annual Awards 2022/23

Spanning over 57 years, the HKIA Annual Awards was launched in 1965. The Hong Kong Institute of Architects Annual Awards is handed out in recognition of outstanding architecture achievements by members of HKIA. The award began in 1965 and is one of the most important architectural awards given out in Hong Kong, acknowledging distinguished merits and offering the much-needed opportunity for public admiration and appreciation.

A total of 99 high quality submissions from both inside and outside Hong Kong were received this year. The awarded projects include not only landmark buildings such as museums, but also social projects such as public spaces and innovations in architectural techniques, which illustrates the diversity and international recognition of the Hong Kong architectural profession. After going through two stages of assessment and in-depth deliberation by 4 renowned jurors in August and September 2023, 44 awards and 20 finalists are given to 57 outstanding projects.


Countryside Renaissance – New Perspectives





Synopsis
According to foreign studies, bird-window collision is regarded as one of the major killers of wild birds (Klem 2009, Lees et al. 2014). Bird-window collision refers to birds colliding into buildings as they are unable to perceive glass or mirror as obstacles, resulting in injuries or even death.
In this seminar, we are delighted to have the representative of HKPDS, Mr. WONG Suet Mei, to share the preliminary findings of the bird-window collision surveys in Hong Kong from 1st September to 31st December 2022, including initial analysis on species and seasonal distribution, mortality rate and so on.
On the other hand, how do architects respond to this issue?
Mr. MK LEUNG will share the overseas standard on assessing threat factors of materials and benchmarks, building zones and elements that have high risk for bird collision, types of bird-friendly glazing, their cost and supply chain readiness, overseas examples. Mr. Tony IP will share about Ecologically Responsible Design Considerations and share overseas and local case studies on the current design practice of nature-centric design, especially bird-friendly design, in urban contexts.

Synopsis
The Environmental Protection Department (EPD) devotes considerable efforts to pre-empting noise problems and keeps abreast of the latest technologies in noise mitigation, as well as providing relevant technical guidelines to industry stakeholders. Below are the highlights of the Practice Notes which have been/would be issued:

Streamlined self-assessment procedures on road traffic noise
To facilitate planning approvals of residential projects and spell out the pragmatic compliance requirements when vetting planning proposals, a Practice Note is to be issued to promulgate a set of streamlined self-assessment procedures.

Traffic noise mitigation using INMD
To facilitate the professionals and practitioners in applying INMD in planning and developing private residential developments, a Practice Note has been issued in Dec 2021. Sound insulation mat between residential units
A Practice Note issued in May this year introduced the application of sound insulation mat between residential units to help reducing noise transmission between upper and lower units and hence alleviate most, if not all, of the domestic noise problems.

5. that the Society shall invite and have as its Patron a person of eminence in colony.

HISTORICAL NOTE

Formation

On 3rd September, 1956, 27 architects gathered and formed a Society “for the general advancement of Civil Architecture and for promoting and facilitating the acquirement of the knowledge of the various Arts and Sciences.” Thus The Hong Kong Society of Architects was formed. On 7th May, 1957, the first amendments were made, to stand for over two and a half years. During this period the membership of the Society increased by 50% and recognition as an Allied Society was given by Royal Institute of British Architects. In accord with this growth further amendments were made to come into effect on 3rd November, 1959. By the end of 1962, the Society expanded to a membership seven times as large as that first body of foundation members. The changes of name from Society to the Institute was effected in 1972 after a great deal of preparatory work, and has initiated a new phase of activity in the Institute’s affairs. Members will use the professional affix – Architect HKIA and describe themselves as Member of The Hong Kong Institute of Architects. Associates will describe themselves as Associate of The Hong Kong Institute of Architects in full. No abbreviation of this is permitted.

Purpose

The two main purposes of the Institute are to continue to raise both the standard of architecture in Hong Kong and the standard of professional services offered by its members.

Code of Professional Conduct

In addition to the responsibilities of architects as professionals under law, members of the institute are governed by a Code of Professional Conduct. This Code aims to provide the standard of professional conduct and self-discipline required of the members of the Institute in the interest the general public.

Discipline

A member whose conduct is found to be in contravention of the Code or dishonouring the principle of the Code is liable to reprimand, suspension or expulsion. This ensures that the public receives from HKIA members only the highest standard of professional service.

Service To The Public

The Institute also serves the public by applying the collective expertise of its members in an advisory role to government and to the building industry. Today, HKIA is represented in numerous consultative or advisory bodies ranging from a working group which counsels the drafting of new building and planning legislation to a committee which formulates standard contracts for use in the building industry.

Architectural Education

In the field of education, the Institute works closely with the two Universities, namely, the University of Hong Kong and the Chinese University of Hong Kong and offers courses and counsel in professional practice and practical experience in architecture.

Professional Qualification

Every year, candidates aspiring to the professional qualification of Architect sit a professional examination held by the Institute. Successful candidates receive recognition not only from professional bodies in Hong Kong but also in UK, Australia, Canada, USA and other countries.

International

Participation In recent years, the Institute takes Hong Kong to the fore in international circles through its active participation in the International Union of Architects (UIA), the Commonwealth Association of Architects (CAA), and the Architects Regional Council of Asia (ARCASIA).

Organization

Today, The Hong Kong Institute of Architects has around 180 Fellows, more than 4,000 Members and over 650 Associates and Graduate Members. The Institute is governed by a Council consisting of a President, two Vice-Presidents, an Honorary Secretary, an Honorary Treasurer, eight Ordinary Members of the Council, the Immediate Past President (ex-officio member) and the Chairmen of the Boards. The Boards, appointed by the Council, are formed to deal with specific areas in the objectives of the Institute. They are the Board of Educational Affairs, Board of External Affairs, Board of Internal Affairs, Board of Local Affairs, Board of Practices and Board of Mainland Affairs. These Boards in turn appoint Committees to deal with matters within the area of responsibility of the Boards.
