Board of Practices (BP)

Draft Security of Payment Legislation (SOPL) Bill

The Development Bureau (DEVB) circulated the draft SOPL Bill with the Institute on 16 May 2022 and organized a Stakeholder Engagement Briefing on 31 May 2022. President Ar. Donald CHOI, Immediate Past President Ar. Felix LI, Vice President Ar. Thomas CHEUNG, Council Members Ar. Stephen HO, Ar. Nicolas HO, Ar. Sunnie LAU, BP Chair Ar. Paul MUI, CDRC Co-chairs Ar. Warren SUEN and Ar. Irene IP, CDRC Deputy Chair Ar. Wilson LAM, Task Force on Architectural Services Chair Ar. Albert CHAN and Deputy Chair Ar. Freddie HAI attended the Briefing.

An Online Forum was organized on 21 Jun 2022 with attendance of 18 Registered Practices (RPs). Upon approval of DEVB on 22 Jun 2022, the draft SOPL Bill was shared with RPs for comments. A meeting with DEVB took place on 29 Jun 2022 to reflect the views collected.

DEVB invited the Listed Architectural Practices (LAPs) to join a Workshop in Jul 2022, Vice President Ar. Thomas CHEUNG attended as an Observer.

The Task Force on Architectural Services drafted a reply to DEVB, stating that the Institute agreed with the original intent of the SOPL in spirit and would support the draft Bill if our comments were duly addressed in a positive manner.

Communication Meeting with DEVB, ArchSD and AAP

The 34th Communication Meeting with DEVB, Architectural Services Department (ArchSD) and The Association of Architectural Practices (AAP) was held on 23 Jul 2022. President Ar. Donald CHOI, VP Ar. Thomas CHEUNG, BP Chair Ar. Paul MUI, BP Members Ar. Albert CHAN and Ar. Franklin YU attended the Meeting.

Adjudicator Nominating Body (ANB)

The Development Bureau appointed HKIA as an ANB, and HKIA formed a Task Force to study the matter.

HKIA had taken up the secretarial service of JDRC since Jan 2022. 17 Arbitration cases and 2 Mediation cases were received in 2022.



Awardees were required to complete the research within 12 months, unless with prior approval by BEdA.



Interim Review Report by the City University of Hong Kong for Bachelor of Science in Architectural Studies

As per the Re-validation Visit of the Bachelor of Science in Architectural Studies offered by the Department of Architecture and Civil Engineering of the City University of Hong Kong (CityU) in 2020, CityU was required to submit the Interim Review reports in 2022 to the Board of Educational Affairs of the HKIA for approval. Transitional Arrangement of Recognising UK Architectural Educational Qualifications as Meeting Eligibility Requirement for Taking Professional Assessment in Hong Kong

Since 2020, the Commonwealth Institute of Architects (CAA) has removed the United Kingdom from the list of recognized programmes, HKIA and ARB started liaising with the Architects Registration Board (ARB UK) on a mutual recognition agreement. Before reaching an agreement, for the sake of students, HKIA/ARB decided to adopt special transitional measures to recognize British architectural education qualifications for their graduates to participate in HKIA/ARB professional assessment. This measure has been extended to candidates enrolled in UK architecture programmes in the 2022/23 academic year, and graduates will be deemed to meet the educational qualifications required to take HKIA/ARB professional assessment.

Professional Assessment (PA)

Papers 3, 4 and 5

In light of the severity and rapid deterioration of the COVID-19 pandemic situation and closure of KITEC, PA 2022 – Papers 3, 4 and 5 (March) was cancelled, and the examinations of Papers 3,4 and 5 were taken in July and October instead.

Professional Interview



This initiative covers five professional areas: architecture, engineering, surveying, landscape, and urban planning, allowing qualified professionals and enterprises from Hong Kong to provide services directly in the Greater Bay Area.

To further facilitate collaboration and promote cross-border opportunities, the Guangdong Provincial Department of Housing and Urban-Rural Development and the Hong Kong Development Bureau jointly organized the "Guangdong-Hong Kong Cooperation Project Sharing" at the City Gallery in Central on 16 December 2021. This cooperation project promotion meeting aimed to introduce construction and engineering projects in the Greater Bay Area open to Hong Kong engineering construction consulting companies. Additionally, the event provided insights into business registration procedures and market entry requirements.

These initiatives signify a significant step towards enhancing cooperation between Guangdong and Hong Kong, fostering the development of the Greater Bay Area, and creating new avenues for professional engagement and growth.



2. “Building a Dream in the Bay Area” Architectural and Urban Design Competition for University Students

This competition, aimed at enhancing college students' understanding of the historic urban culture and unique heritage of the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area, was organized jointly by the China Overseas Charity Foundation and Bauhinia Magazine in collaboration with HKIA and the Hong Kong Urban Design Institute.

It took place from December 2021 to June 2022, providing a platform for students to showcase their creativity and talent in architecture and urban design.

The competition's success highlights the commitment to fostering cultural appreciation, promoting innovative urban design, and nurturing young talent within the Greater Bay Area.

當前氣候變化反復無常，溫室氣體排放加劇導致全球氣候變暖，影響人類社會的發展。為了應對氣候變化帶來的影響，全球195個國家等起來簽署了巴黎協定，承諾將本世紀全球平均氣溫上升幅度控制在1.5°C以內，並加強對溫室氣體排放的削減。作為全球第一份具有法律約束力的國際條約，我國積極出台了節能減排的“雙碳”、“1.5°C”雙碳政策。香港地產政府也於2021年公佈了最新的《香港氣候行動藍圖》，制定了更為嚴格的減碳策略和應對氣候變化措施。

在國際國內社會都致力於節能減碳的大背景下，作為建築與地產行業的我們，應如何在參與與世界各地建築師、設計、裝修、拆改、施工、供應及安裝工作的同時，通過專業知識與經驗，從建築生命週期的每個階段為可持續發展和節能減排出一點點力和改變，為地球、為國家、為社會貢獻專業力量，帶出適應本世紀的建築，將會給我們過高的挑戰與機會。如何立法、執業與建設，和各位共同探討應對氣候變化的有效對策，為應對全球氣候變暖，協作努力。


Present

Future



Deed of Constitution

The Hong Kong Institute of Architects



WE, THE UNDERSIGNED being met together on the third day of September in the year one thousand nine hundred and fifty-six and being desirous of forming a Society in the Colony of Hong Kong for the general advancement of Civil Architecture and for promoting and facilitating the acquirement of the knowledge of the various Arts and Sciences connected therewith DO HEREBY BAND OURSELVES TOGETHER IN A SOCIETY TO BE KNOWN AS THE HONG KONG SOCIETY OF ARCHITECTS and do undertake as Foundation Members to subscribe to the funds and be bound by the Rules of the Society AND DO FURTHER DECLARE AND AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. that the Society shall consist of Members, Honorary Members, Associates, Graduates and Students;
2. that the Society shall elect and be governed by a Council consisting of a President, two Vice-Presidents, and such other Officers and Members of Council as it may decide;
3. that the Society shall make such Rules for its own good governance and the conduct of its members as it may from time to time think fit;
4. that the Society shall have power in its corporate name to acquire, hold and dispose of property and funds and shall to this end comply with Ordinances of the Government of Hong Kong;
5. that the Society shall invite and have as its Patron a person of eminence in colony.



Historical Notes

Formation

On 3rd September, 1956, 27 architects gathered and formed a Society “for the general advancement of Civil Architecture and for promoting and facilitating the acquirement of the knowledge of the various Arts and Sciences.” Thus The Hong Kong Society of Architects was formed. On 7th May, 1957, the first amendments were made, to stand for over two and a half years. During this period the membership of the Society increased by 50% and recognition as an Allied Society was given by Royal Institute of British Architects. In accord with this growth further amendments were made to come into effect on 3rd November, 1959. By the end of 1962, the Society expanded to a membership seven times as large as that first body of foundation members. The changes of name from Society to the Institute was effected in 1972 after a great deal of preparatory work, and has initiated a new phase of activity in the Institute’s affairs. Members will use the professional affix – Architect HKIA and describe themselves as Member of The Hong Kong Institute of Architects. Associates will describe themselves as Associate of The Hong Kong Institute of Architects in full. No abbreviation of this is permitted.

Purpose

The two main purposes of the Institute are to continue to raise both the standard of architecture in Hong Kong and the standard of professional services offered by its members.

Code of Professional Conduct

In addition to the responsibilities of architects as professionals under law, members of the institute are governed by a Code of Professional Conduct. This Code aims to provide the standard of professional conduct and self-discipline required of the members of the Institute in the interest the general public.

Discipline

A member whose conduct is found to be in contravention of the Code or dishonouring the principle of the Code is liable to reprimand, suspension or expulsion. This ensures that the public receives from HKIA members only the highest standard of professional service.

Service To The Public

The Institute also serves the public by applying the collective expertise of its members in an advisory role to government and to the building industry. Today, HKIA is represented in numerous consultative or advisory bodies ranging from a working group which counsels the drafting of new building and planning legislation to a committee which formulates standard contracts for use in the building industry.

Architectural Education

In the field of education, the Institute works closely with the two Universities, namely, the University of Hong Kong and the Chinese University of Hong Kong and offers courses and counsel in professional practice and practical experience in architecture.

Professional Qualification

Every year, candidates aspiring to the professional qualification of Architect sit a professional examination held by the Institute. Successful candidates receive recognition not only from professional bodies in Hong Kong but also in UK, Australia, Canada, USA and other countries.

International


Participation In recent years, the Institute takes Hong Kong to the fore in international circles through its active participation in the International Union of Architects (UIA), the Commonwealth Association of Architects (CAA), and the Architects Regional Council of Asia (ARCASIA).

Organization

Today, The Hong Kong Institute of Architects has around 180 Fellows, more than 4,000 Members and over 650 Associates and Graduate Members. The Institute is governed by a Council consisting of a President, two Vice-Presidents, an Honorary Secretary, an Honorary Treasurer, eight Ordinary Members of the Council, the Immediate Past President (ex-officio member) and the Chairmen of the Boards. The Boards, appointed by the Council, are formed to deal with specific areas in the objectives of the Institute. They are the Board of Educational Affairs, Board of External Affairs, Board of Internal Affairs, Board of Local Affairs, Board of Practices and Board of Mainland Affairs. These Boards in turn appoint Committees to deal with matters within the area of responsibility of the Boards.
