

President's Message



President's Message

Dear Members,

Despite the lingering COVID-related lockdown and social restrictions in 2021, the Council has strived our best to serve the needs of our members and enhance our communication with members. Similar to the previous year, many of our events had to go online, including CPDs, Board and Committee meetings, and quarterly general meetings. Of course, social distancing regulations and frequent facility closedowns meant that our sports and other socializing activities could barely be held. Overseas missions and exhibitions were also postponed. Nonetheless, we managed to carry on with our awards selections, competitions and both local and overseas engagements.

Commencement of 65th Anniversary Celebration

As you know, 2021 marked the 65th anniversary of HKIA. We kick-started our year-long celebration of this important milestone with a series of activities planned under the theme of “Architecture for People 人人建築” in September. Such activities of “past”, “present” and “future” are organized to illustrate the humanity side of Hong Kong architects and architecture, and are from the Members, for the Members, with the Members, which no doubt be supported by the Members.

The “past” category involves the establishment of the Humanity Bank to collect and celebrate our fellow architects’ contribution to humanity and community through their voluntary works, community workshops and building projects over the past 65 years. The Humanity Bank is expected to be an ongoing project, with submissions being added annually.

Under the “present” category is a series of voluntary work and community programmes initiated to put your expertise into good use for building a more inclusive and liveable community. For instance, the charity movie screening of “Anita” with post-film sharing session by the film director and his team in November enabled us to raise funds for a charitable organization as well as engaging the public.

In addition to admiring the past glory and achievements of HKIA during our anniversary celebration, we set our vision on the future, on succession and on the young generations. The planned initiatives under the “future” category include student competitions, Young Architect Award, and Architect’s Talks for fellow Members to return to their alma mater to share their career experience.

Proactive Participation in Public Affairs

We are glad that Tony TSE won the December Legislative Council election to continue representing the Architectural, Surveying, Planning and Landscape professionals. Tony has been reflecting our members' views efficiently and effectively to the Government and we expect to continue this close relationship in the coming year.

The Institute had two Experience Sharing Sessions with the Architectural Services Department (ArchSD) mainly for HKIA Band 3 architects in the year. About 20 consultants have joined to present their projects and experience.

To make good use of the regular bi-annual communication meetings between HKIA corporate members and ArchSD and the Development Bureau (DEVB), the Institute has arranged a pre-meeting with our Band 1, 2 and 3 firms before such meetings. The purpose is to consolidate our practices' views and speak with one strong voice.

HKIA has submitted an application to become an Adjudicator Nominating Body (ANB) for the Security of Payment Legislation (SOPL), which is being processed by DEVB. We would work on securing the ANB status, so as to uphold the leading role of architects in construction projects.

During the year, we exchanged views with government agencies and other authorities/ organizations on the following major issues:

- Implementation of the spirit of SOPL in all new public work contracts
- Publishing HKIA's Initial Response to the 2021 Policy Address, based on the views collected from various Boards and Committees
- Exchanging views with the Urban Renewal Authority (URA) on the District Study for Yau Ma Tei and Mong Kok
- Proposed Grading of Bishop Hill Underground Service Reservoir
- Exploring with other professional institutes on presenting joint statement on the Yuen Long Barrage Scheme and Improvement of Yuen Long Town Nullah projects
- Engaging in the consultation for studies and policy/work practice review, such as the Study on Active Design for Healthier Lifestyle, Invigorating Island South Developments, review of the minimum entry criteria for Consultants Lists of the Architectural and Associated Consultants Selection Board (AACSB), draft manual of BEAM Plus for Existing Schools, BEAM Plus Interiors Major Revision, draft practice note on Innovative Noise Mitigation Designs against Road Traffic, Lantau Tomorrow Vision, etc

Expanding International Engagement

Recognition of UK academic qualifications

HKIA and the Architects Registration Board (ARB) of HKSAR have been negotiating with the Architects Registration Board UK (ARB UK) on possible agreement on mutual recognition of each other's accreditation systems.

Amidst the ongoing negotiation, the enrolment process of UK schools' 2022/23 programmes has started. To facilitate school choices of students and parents, HKIA and ARB have endorsed extending the 2-year transitional arrangement of recognition of UK architectural programmes for an additional year. In other words, those who commence UK architectural studies in 2022/23 academic year would be recognised as fulfilling the academic requirement for taking the HKIA/ARB Professional Assessment upon graduation. Before reaching confirmation, we would review the issue of extending the grace period regularly.

International Union of Architects (UIA)

During the year, HKIA made more than 20 nominations for our representation in the various Work Programmes and Commissions of UIA for the new term of 2021 to 2023. HKIA representatives also participated actively in various UIA activities, including the 27th UIA World Congress of Architects (UIA 2021 RIO), International UIA Region IV Presidents Meeting and UIA Work Programme "Architecture & Children" Meeting. The "UIA WP Architecture for All" website (uiawpafa.hkia.net) hosted by HKIA was bestowed the Gold Award under the Web Accessibility Recognition Scheme (WARS) 2020-2021. Two Hong Kong projects were also recognised with UIA's Friendly and Inclusive Spaces Awards:

- Honourable Mention (New Buildings Category): "A Special School for Children with Mild Intellectual Disability" by ArchSD in collaboration with Thomas Chow Architects Limited
- Winner (Research Category): "Support Ageing through Design" by ArchSD.

Canberra Accord

Due to global lockdown and travel restrictions under the COVID pandemic, the Canberra Accord General Meeting was held online from 24 to 25 June. Core members specialized in education and accreditation business of both HKIA and ARB attended the meeting. It is particularly exciting that Dr Rosman WAI, Deputy Chair of the HKIA Board of Educational Affairs was elected as Chair of the Canberra Accord for the term 2021-2023.

Architects Regional Council Asia (ARCASIA)

During 2021, HKIA representatives participated actively in the promotion and adjudication of ARCASIA awards and competitions, including ARCASIA Awards for Architecture, Students Architectural Design Competition, Thesis of the Year Award, and Ar. Barry Will Award. Our members also engaged in other ARCASIA activities as well, including the ACA 19 Friendship Night at which our members sung a celebration song composed by our member Tony Wong, Student Jamboree, Forum, Webinar for COVID pandemic, Special Interim ARCASIA (Architects Regional Council Asia) Council Meeting, ARCASIA Committee on Social Responsibility Meeting, the COVID-19 special issue of ARCASIA publication Architecture Asia (AA) under the theme of “Building a Healthy Future”, etc.

Eastern Regional Organisation for Planning and Housing (EAROPH)

HKIA joined EAROPH as an Organisational Member in September. A non-governmental multi-sectorial organisation encompassing the private, public and academic sectors, EAROPH works in foster exchanges of insights and experiences among jurisdictions in Asia, Australasia and the Pacific region. As an EAROPH member, HKIA hopes to bring more opportunities for our Members to engage with peers in the region in planning, development and management so as to improve the quality and sustainability of human settlements.

Promoting Architectural Excellence

Venice Biennale International Architectural Exhibition (VB2020)

The Hong Kong Response Exhibition of VB2020 was launch at City Gallery, Central from October till December. The opening ceremony was officiated by the Under Secretary for Commerce and Economic Development Dr. Bernard Chan Pak-li. Under the theme of “Redistribution: Land, People, and Environment”, the exhibition displays the perspectives of architects on climate change, scarce land resources, heritage conservation and talent development. Besides the exhibition, there were also a series of workshops and symposium.

Architecture Exhibitions in Mainland and Overseas

Funding applications for several architecture exhibitions for showcasing Hong Kong’s creative talents and innovative designs are underway. With details to be confirmed, they shall be staged in 2022.

- Architecture Exhibition in Beijing and Hangzhou and New York, in celebrating the 25th Anniversary of the establishment of the HKSAR.
- Bi-City Biennale of Urbanism\ Architecture (UABB2022) with two concurrent exhibitions in Hong Kong and Shenzhen.

Cross-Strait Architectural Design Symposium and Awards (CADSA 2019)

The roving exhibition originally planned for staging in Guangzhou or Shenzhen had to be cancelled due to anti-pandemic policies. Nevertheless, we were able to stage a physical exhibition in December at V Gallery of Vessel, Kwun Tong Promenade, so that the public could appreciate in person the many creative exhibits. A virtual exhibition was also uploaded to the event website.

Young Architect Award (YAA) and Competitions

The theme of YAA2020 was quite a timely one, i.e. “Revitalization of Bishop Hill Underground Cistern”. The winner was picked from 25 submissions received, and they were offered a 3-week overseas architectural study trip.

HKIA provided our members opportunities to showcase their talents through organising, co-organising and promoting architectural design competitions in 2021, such as:

- Design Competition for Hong Kong Observatory Tide Gauge Station at Tai Po Kau which received an overwhelming response of 45 valid entries, many of high quality.
- HKIA x CIC Logo and Trophy Design Competition with 11 submissions.
- Architectural Design Idea Competition for SDG Eco- Village Transitional Housing Project organised by the Professional Green Building Council (PGBC), with HKIA and Hong Kong Construction Association being the co-organisers, and 22 submissions received.
- Design Competition on Green Link, Wong Chuk Hang, co-organised by HKIA, the Invigorating Island South Office (IISO) of DEVB, and ArchSD.
- Design Competition for Transformation of Sensory Garden at Kwun Tong Promenade co-organized by HKIA, and the Energizing Kowloon East Office of DEVB and ArchSD.

Looking Forward

In the very beginning of my term as HKIA's President, the Council and I pledged to make HKIA more relevant to our Members, our profession and our society. Upon the review of the first year of my term, I am proud to say that we have been able to meet our commitments despite the challenging environment.

To better serve members through more effective and efficient use of space, resources and upgraded equipment, we have decided to renovate the HKIA Premises, which has been serving members for more than 15 years. Renovation is expected to take place in 2022. The new premises will have user-friendly designs and upgraded audio-visual and lighting systems fit for not only lectures, meetings, but also members' sharing, networking and even simply stop-over for a cup of tea.

For more effective use of the Institute's resources, our HKIA-Beijing Representative Office will move to a new venue in 2022 (Room C05, 3/F, Building A, Parkview Green, No.9 Dongdaqiao Road, Chaoyang District), with establishment downsized. Yet, rest assured that its services for members in both the Mainland and Hong Kong would not be affected.

I must thank all my Council peers, who put in time and efforts to make the works of 2021 most meaningful and fruitful. I sincerely thank our Members, who have given valuable diverse views and staunch support to the Institute. My gratitude also goes to our friends and partners in various organisations and government departments, who have worked with us to make Hong Kong a better home to live in. Lastly, my heartfelt thanks go to Secretariat staff who have helped put our words into deeds.

Looking ahead, with the pandemic challenges subsiding, I am confident that the Hong Kong community as well as our profession would revive and grow in no time. I look forward to meet you all face-to-face in the various events of the Institute, ranging from educational seminars, sharing sessions, to sports and social networking activities, and of course the many Anniversary initiatives in 2022.

Board of Practices (BP)

Security of Payment Legislation

The Development Bureau (DEVB) invited HKIA to comment on a new Technical Circular (Works) to implement the spirit of Security of Payment Legislation (SOPL) in all new public work contracts to be launched some time in 2021. After consultation with BP and Council, a reply stating the concerns of members, particularly corporate members, on the proposal was made on 6 May 2021.

HKIA was invited to apply as an Adjudicator Nominating Body (ANB) for SOPL. The application for Adjudicator Nominating Body (ANB) for SOPL and supplementary information was submitted to the DEVB on 15 Sep 2021 and 3 Nov 2021 respectively.

In the written reply by DEVB dated 24 December 2022, HKIA had been admitted to the Register of Adjudicator Nominating Bodies.

Reviewing Minimum Entry Criteria for Consultants Lists of AACSB

HKIA was invited by DEVB to review the Minimum Entry Criteria for Consultants Lists of the Architectural and Associated Consultants Selection Board (AACSB). After consultation with BP and registered practices (RP), a reply incorporating unfiltered comments collected was sent to DEVB in late May 2021.

A meeting on the review of minimum entry criteria for consultants list of AACSB with DEVB and the Architectural Services Department (ArchSD) was held on 22 Jul 2021. President Donald CHOI, Council members and BP members attended the meeting and reflected our concerns on the captioned subject matter to DEVB.

Practice Survey

Three practice surveys were conducted:

- Business in Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area
- Reviewing Minimum Entry Criteria for Consultants Lists of AACSB
- Collection of Opinions on the Public Work Projects to ArchSD

Group Subscription on International Standards Online Library Service

An expression of interest was sent to the RPs. 6 RPs confirmed subscribing to the service at a discounted rate.

HKIA Directory of Architectural Practices 2021

The electronic version of the HKIA Directory could be viewed and downloaded from the HKIA website (<https://www.hkia.net/en/knowledge-resource/hkia-publications.html#hkia-directory>) starting from 10 December 2021 while the printed copies were available for corporate members, full members and fellows to collect at the HKIA Premises from 20 December 2021 to 21 January 2022. A complimentary copy was reserved for each corporate member and 100 complimentary copies was reserved for full members and fellows to collect on a first-come-first-served basis.

Experience Sharing Sessions with ArchSD – HKIA Band 3 Registered Practices

Two rounds of sharing sessions were held:

Apr–Jun 2021: Ten band 3 companies attended the sharing session.

Nov–Dec 2021: Nine band 3 companies attended the sharing session.

Band 1 and 2 architectural consultants and contractors in Group C were invited to attend the Band 3 sharing sessions.

Webinars

Three webinars on the following topics were held:

The webinar on the New Standard Form of Building Contract was held on 14 May 2021. 83 members participated in the event.

The webinar about the application procedures and minimum entry criteria for joining AACSB Bands 1 and 2 Architectural Consultants was held on 16 Jun 2021. 55 members participated in the event.

The online Briefing Session about the Implementation of the Spirit of Security of Payment Legislation (SOPL) in Public Works Contracts was held on 9 Jul 2021. 64 members participated in the event.

3rd Round of BIM Pro Top-up Training

The 3rd round of BIM Pro Top-up Training Programme was held on 10, 17 and 24 Apr 2021. 58 members and RP representatives attended the training and 32 passed the multiple-choice assessment. The passing rate was 55%.

The 4th round of BIM Pro Top-up Training Programme was held on 17, 24 and 31 Jul 2021. 24 members and RP representatives attended the training. 22 participated in the assessment and 18 passed the assessment. The passing rate was 81.8%.

The 5th round of BIM Pro Top-up Training Programme was held on 9, 16 and 23 Oct 2021. 22 members and RP representatives attended the training. 20 participated in the assessment and 10 passed the assessment. The passing rate was 50%.

HKIA BIM Pro and BIM Co Accreditation Programme

As of 4 Feb 2021, 150 applications were received. 74 applications were completed. 39 were under review by the assessment panel. 37 with pending documents from applicants. Names of the approved members were uploaded on HKIA website (<https://www.hkia.net/en/architects-practices/hkia-list-of-specialists.html>).

HKIA BIM Professional Certification

As of 16 Aug 2021, 154 applications were received. 116 application assessments were completed. 11 were under review by the assessment panel. 4 with pending documents from applicants. The approved number of BIM Pros and BIM Cos was 80 and 9 respectively. Names of the approved members were uploaded on HKIA website (<https://www.hkia.net/en/architects-practices/hkia-list-of-specialists.html>).

Proposal of Streamlining Processing of CCBC and HKIA BIM Co

The BIM and Smart City Committee was in discussion with CIC in preparation of a proposal of streamlining processing of CIC Certified BIM Coordinators and the HKIA BIM Co, including but not limited to aligning the qualification requirements and simplifying the assessment procedures.

Construction Site Visit

Co-organised by HKICM and HKIA, a construction site visit to Main Contract Works for Proposed Primary School and Kindergarten Development at Lot 1928 in DD107, Au Tau, Yuen Long, N.T. was held on 14 Aug 2021. 7 members participated in the visit.

Geospatial Lab Site Visit

A site visit to Geospatial Lab in Kwun Tong was held on 11 Oct 2021. 13 members attended the visit.

Report on Special Projects

The 17th Venice Biennale International Architectural Exhibition and Hong Kong Pre-exhibition (VB2021)

The sixth webinar themed “Redistributing the Hong Kong Harbourfront” on 2 Feb 2021 attracted 130 participants and 300 number of views via Zoom and Facebook platforms.

The originally planned City Gallery exhibition at Q1 2021 was postponed due to the COVID-19 situation and the delayed renovation progress informed by the Planning Department. The Curatorial Team explored the possibility of organising a physical exhibition at City Gallery as the venue would be available for the rest of 2021.

Although La Biennale Di Venezia confirmed early this year that the official opening of VB2021 would be held on 22 May as scheduled, the Co-organisers HKIABF and HKADC would take the health risks and extra costs for quarantine into consideration if joining the Venice Exhibition in person. As such, they proposed to Venice Biennale Office for a change in exhibition participation to a digital format.

A pre-recorded congratulatory video for the commencement of VB2021 in Venice was produced with messages from HKIA President and VB Chief Curator Donald CHOI, HKIABF Chair Helen LEUNG, HKADC Chief Executive Winsome CHOW and Head of CreateHK Victor TSANG.

127 people participated in Webinar 7 held on 29 Mar 2021 themed “Form Follows Systems” with WONG Mun Summ, Founding Director of WOHA, as guest speaker and Curators LEE Hoyin and YU Ka Sing being the moderators.

Webinar 8

Themed “Journey to Design 1”, Webinar 8 was held on 1 Jun 2021 with 48 participants. The webinar invited VB2021 exhibitors Kharlie TANG of ALKF together with Paulina NEISCH and Louie SIEH of City University of Hong Kong, as speakers. Curator YU Ka Sing was the moderator.

Webinar 9

Themed “New Portraits of Hong Kong”, Webinar 9 was held on 28 Jul 2021 with selected exhibitor representatives as speakers and YU Ka Sing as moderator. A total of 35 participants attended the event.

Webinar 10

Themed “Old + New”, Webinar 10 was held on 27 Sep 2021 with selected exhibitor representatives as speakers and YU Ka Sing as moderator. A total of 31 participants attended the event.

2019 Bi-City Biennale of Urbanism\ Architecture (Hong Kong) (UABBHK2019)

The Curatorial Team produced the publication as a record for the UABBHK2019 project. The online version could be found from the event website. About 200 hard copies were printed and dispatched to the relevant project stakeholders and libraries for public reference in Dec 2021.

Shenzhen organiser of UABB confirmed that the upcoming exhibition would be postponed to 2022. The Create Smart Initiative application for the next UABB was submitted in Sep 2021.

Cross-Strait Architectural Design Symposium and Awards (CADSA) 2019 – Roving Exhibitions

Due to COVID-19, the roving exhibitions at a Cross-Strait City and a Belt and Road City were postponed. The two exhibitions targeted to be held before 30 Jun 2021. The Roving Exhibition in Macau was held from 6–20 Jul 2021.

The roving exhibition in Guangzhou or Shenzhen and Malaysia was replaced by a virtual exhibition. A physical exhibition was set up in Dec 2021 to produce a virtual exhibition uploaded onto the event website (<https://www.hkia.net/cadsa/2019>).

HKIA Architecture Exhibitions in Beijing, Hangzhou and New York

Beijing and Hangzhou Exhibition

A CSI funding application for the captioned exhibition was in preparation.

Besides Beijing and Hangzhou, a response show would be held in Hong Kong in Sep 2022.

Tentatively, the architecture exhibition in Beijing and Hangzhou would be held in late Jun/Jul 2022 and late Jul/Aug 2022, respectively.

New York Exhibition

A funding application was under review by the Hong Kong Economic and Trade Office, New York.

Open Call for Curator Briefing Session and Interviews

The Open Call for Curator Briefing Session was held on 1 Nov 2021. 15 people attended the briefing. The Curator Interview Session was held on 27 Nov 2021.



Strategic Plan

1. To maintain our exposure in the international professional arena, such as ARCASIA, UIA, CAA and EAROPH. For UIA and CAA, the no. of votes is per GDP of member country; whereas in ARCASIA, two votes per member country. HKIA participates as one of the leaders in ARCASIA and UIA. To nominate HKIA's representatives to participate in different UIA, CAA, ARCASIA sub-committees/ work programmes and to attend the overseas events etc.
2. To work out long-term strategies with The Architectural Society of China (ASC) regarding the international presence of HKIA and ASC (with BMA).
3. To promote young architects to China, to promote HK architectural services to S.E. Asia, India and the Middle East (Belt and Road) in collaboration with the Trade Development Council for holding fairs outside Hong Kong (with BP/BMA).

Architects Regional Council of Asia ("ARCASIA")

HKIA maintained close relationship with ARCASIA in 2021. As the COVID-19 pandemic swept across the world, most of the ARCASIA activities were cancelled or postponed. Despite the challenges, ARCASIA organised a numbers of webinars, online workshops and sharing sessions to keep all member sections closely connected. HKIA representatives attended virtual meetings and webinars to discuss and share experiences and practices of handling the pandemic situations with ARCASIA colleagues.

In consideration of the difficulties of the pandemic year, ARCASIA announced to waive 50% of the member section subscription fee for 2021.







He is the first ever architect in Hong Kong as an outstanding practitioner, educator and LegCo member advocating architecture in parallel with sustained success at the same time.




Qianhai Development

Deed of Constitution

WE, THE UNDERSIGNED being met together on the third day of September in the year one thousand nine hundred and fifty-six and being desirous of forming a Society in the Colony of Hong Kong for the general advancement of Civil Architecture and for promoting and facilitating the acquirement of the knowledge of the various Arts and Sciences connected therewith DO HEREBY BAND OURSELVES TOGETHER IN A SOCIETY TO BE KNOWN AS THE HONG KONG SOCIETY OF ARCHITECTS and do undertake as Foundation Members to subscribe to the funds and be bound by the Rules of the Society AND DO FURTHER DECLARE AND AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. that the Society shall consist of Members, Honorary Members, Associates, Graduates and Students;
2. that the Society shall elect and be governed by a Council consisting of a President, two Vice-Presidents, and such other Officers and Members of Council as it may decide;
3. that the Society shall make such Rules for its own good governance and the conduct of its members as it may from time to time think fit;
4. that the Society shall have power in its corporate name to acquire, hold and dispose of property and funds and shall to this end comply with Ordinances of the Government of Hong Kong;
5. that the Society shall invite and have as its Patron a person of eminence in colony.

Historical Notes

Formation

On 3rd September, 1956, 27 architects gathered and formed a Society “for the general advancement of Civil Architecture and for promoting and facilitating the acquirement of the knowledge of the various Arts and Sciences.” Thus The Hong Kong Society of Architects was formed. On 7th May, 1957, the first amendments were made, to stand for over two and a half years. During this period the membership of the Society increased by 50% and recognition as an Allied Society was given by Royal Institute of British Architects. In accord with this growth further amendments were made to come into effect on 3rd November, 1959. By the end of 1962, the Society expanded to a membership seven times as large as that first body of foundation members. The changes of name from Society to the Institute was effected in 1972 after a great deal of preparatory work, and has initiated a new phase of activity in the Institute's affairs. Members will use the professional affix – Architect HKIA and describe themselves as Member of The Hong Kong Institute of Architects. Associates will describe themselves as Associate of The Hong Kong Institute of Architects in full. No abbreviation of this is permitted.

Purpose

The two main purposes of the Institute are to continue to raise both the standard of architecture in Hong Kong and the standard of professional services offered by its members.

Code of Professional Conduct

In addition to the responsibilities of architects as professionals under law, members of the institute are governed by a Code of Professional Conduct. This Code aims to provide the standard of professional conduct and self-discipline required of the members of the Institute in the interest the general public.

Discipline

A member whose conduct is found to be in contravention of the Code or dishonouring the principle of the Code is liable to reprimand, suspension or expulsion. This ensures that the public receives from HKIA members only the highest standard of professional service.

Service To The Public

The Institute also serves the public by applying the collective expertise of its members in an advisory role to government and to the building industry. Today, HKIA is represented in numerous consultative or advisory bodies ranging from a working group which counsels the drafting of new building and planning legislation to a committee which formulates standard contracts for use in the building industry.

Architectural Education

In the field of education, the Institute works closely with the two Universities, namely, the University of Hong Kong and the Chinese University of Hong Kong and offers courses and counsel in professional practice and practical experience in architecture.

Professional Qualification

Every year, candidates aspiring to the professional qualification of Architect sit a professional examination held by the Institute. Successful candidates receive recognition not only from professional bodies in Hong Kong but also in UK, Australia, Canada, USA and other countries.

International

Participation In recent years, the Institute takes Hong Kong to the fore in international circles through its active participation in the International Union of Architects (UIA), the Commonwealth Association of Architects (CAA), and the Architects Regional Council of Asia (ARCASIA).

Organization

Today, The Hong Kong Institute of Architects has around 180 Fellows, more than 3,000 Members and over 600 Associates and Graduate Members. The Institute is governed by a Council consisting of a President, two Vice-Presidents, an Honorary Secretary, an Honorary Treasurer, eight Ordinary Members of the Council, the Immediate Past President (ex-officio member) and the Chair of the Boards. The Boards, appointed by the Council, are formed to deal with specific areas in the objectives of the Institute. They are the Board of Educational Affairs, Board of External Affairs, Board of Internal Affairs, Board of Local Affairs, Board of Practices and Board of Mainland Affairs. These Boards in turn appoint Committees to deal with matters within the area of responsibility of the Boards.
