President's Message

Dear Members,

2018 is a fruitful year for the Institute with remarkable achievements and advancements both at home and abroad. I am pleased to report our significant endeavours of the year.

Promoting Architectural Excellence

Venice Biennale International Architecture Exhibition 2018

It is the seventh time for the Institute and the Hong Kong Arts Development Council to jointly organise the Hong Kong Exhibition. Themed "Vertical Fabric: density in landscape", 111 different tower-form installations by 94 Hong Kong and overseas architects were featured in Venice during May to November 2018. Surpassing the past editions of Hong Kong Exhibition, we had the largest group of exhibitors as well as the exhibits this time. Curated by Prof. Wang Weijen, the exhibition was concluded with great success. Let's look forward to the Response Exhibition to be held in Hong Kong in March 2019.

HKIA Annual Awards 2017/18

Riding on the positive feedbacks received on the revamped format of the Annual Awards 2016/17, we continued to honour our members and their outstanding works to a wider extent of recognition. A 5-day exhibition of the 2017/18 Award-winning and finalist projects was held at Pacific Place in early November, while the presentation for the Award was made at the HKIA Annual Ball on 3 November 2018.

Promoting Our Profession and Members

Tokyo Exhibition

Thanks to the support by Hong Kong Economic and Trade Office (Tokyo) of the HKSAR Government and The Japan Institute of Architects (JIA), the first-ever exhibition hosted by HKIA in Japan, "MORE THAN HIGH-RISE – Exploring Hong Kong through Architecture", was successfully held in November 2018 in Tokyo. I was particularly impressed to see how our young professionals rose to the challenges of this overseas event. Their exhibits on show received many positive feedback and appreciation from the local community and from Hong Kong. There was a fruitful discussion on "Opportunities and Challenges for Hong Kong and Japanese Young Architects" at an open forum too. The dedicated efforts of Exhibition Project Leaders Immediate Past President Mr. Vincent Ng and Honorary Secretary Prof. Paul Chu were part and parcel to this huge success.

Qianhai Design Competition

To attract more Hong Kong young architects and architectural students to get involved in the development of Qianhai, Qianhai Shenzhen-Hong Kong Modern Service Industry Cooperation Zone Administration Authority commissioned HKIA to jointly organise a Qianhai Design Competition. The winning team was appointed for further design development consulting services at the award presentation ceremony on 30 June 2018 while the exhibition of the Competition was successfully conducted at PMQ, Hong Kong and at Qianhai

during June to July. Plenty of positive feedback were received for the works of our young architects.

HKIA Furniture Design Competition 2018

After the successful launching of the first HKIA Furniture Design Competition in 2017, the Young Members Committee continued to organise the event in 2018. The winning multi-use sets were showcased at The Center, Central in November and at City University of Hong Kong in December respectively. After the exhibition, the winning prototypes manufactured were donated to under-privileged families for their use.

Collaboration with Professional Bodies on Issues of Common Interests

Proposed Footbridge in Yuen Long

The proposed footbridge in Yuen Long had aroused much debates in the society. As professionals who shape our built environment, architects should have the responsibility to reflect to the Government and the general public on issues of critical concerns. After several rounds of communication meetings with the Government officials, the professional alliance, HKIA, HKILA, HKIP, HKIS as well as HKIUD, was not convinced that the proposed footbridge could effectively resolve the congestion problems in the Yuen Long town centre as claimed. On the contrary, it would bring irreversible damages to the environment. A Joint Institutes' Press Conference was held on 17 July 2018 to communicate our concerns to the public and to urge all parties to make an effort to make Hong Kong a more livable city.

Land Supply Issues

As the key professional bodies in land, planning and development i.e. HKIA, HKILA, HKIP and HKIS, we are obliged to assist and contribute in the current debate on land supply. After the Joint Institutes' Members Forum in May and continuous communications, a concerted view on principle issues was formulated by the four Institutes, which was presented at the Joint Institutes' Press Conference held on 22 August 2018. Given the practical uncertainties of land creation / rezoning exercise under the current social and political context, as well as the unpredictability of global economic development, it was suggested that a multi-pronged approach should be adopted and a "land bank" should be set up. The four institutes stressed that it is imperative to have proper holistic planning, which embraces the principle of "a livable city" before any land is formed or transformed for development.

Following the launch of Lantau Tomorrow Vision in the Policy Address 2018, HKIA worked with the other three institutes again together with the Office of the Hon Tony Tse Wai Chuen to organise a Joint Institutes' Forum on 12 December 2018 to exchange professional views on this grand development plan.

Communications with HKSAR Government

The Institute had been in constant and constructive dialogue with senior Government officials and relevant bureaus to reflect our professional views and aspirations on various issues for policy makers in formulating the Policy Address and relevant strategies for the future.

Communications with the Mainland

Belt and Road Initiatives

The Institute was proactively engaging in the development of the Belt and Road Initiatives. As President, I was invited to participate in various related events throughout the year such as the HKSAR Government Seminar on "Strategies and Opportunities under the Belt and Road Initiative - Leveraging Hong Kong's Advantages" in Beijing in February, Hong Kong Trade Development Council (HKTDC) Belt and Road Global Forum and the first annual Roundtable in June, etc. There were in-depth discussions and examination on the initiatives from different perspectives.

Visit by Mainland Officials

Coordinated by the HKSAR Government, Mr. Wang Shengwen, Director-General of the Department of Foreign Assistance, Ministry of Commerce and Mr. Wang Ligui, visited HKIA Premises on 8 February 2018. They were presented with a comprehensive introduction of the history and organisational structure of the HKIA as well as our full architects services in Hong Kong. We also exchanged views on the strength of the Hong Kong professionals and explored more business opportunities for our architects in Mainland as well as abroad, in line with the aspiration of the Belt and Road Initiatives and the Greater Bay Area.

Development of the Greater Bay Area

HKIA joined with Guangdong Engineering Exploration & Design Association, Guangzhou Exploration & Design Association, Shenzhen Exploration & Design

Association and Architects Association of Macau to form an alliance with a view to materialise the notion of "conglomeration, collaboration and co-winning" in response to the rapid economic and infrastructural development in the Greater Bay Area. A Preparation Ceremony cum Forum on promoting architects' professional full services was held on 9 March 2018 in Shenzhen. In October, I participated in the joint institutes' visit to the Greater Bay Area organised by Office of LegCo Member Hon Tony Tse. We were introduced to the grand city planning of Huizhou, the new projects for a livable city and the water quality monitoring and control work in place.

Visit to Liaison Office of the Central People's Government in the Hong Kong S.A.R.

On 13 December 2018, HKIA delegation paid a visit to the Liaison Office of the Central People's Government in the Hong Kong S.A.R. We were received by leaders from the Department of Education and Technology including the Director-General Prof. Li Lu and the Deputy Director-General Mr. Xia Jia Hong. There was an open and fruitful exchange of ideas on various possible collaborations in the coming year between the Institute and the Liaison Office to promote architectural excellence, and to explore the development opportunities for Hong Kong architects and young professionals in particular in the Greater Bay Area and under the Belt and Road initiatives.

Communications with International Bodies

Full Signatory Status of Canberra Accord

I am pleased to share with you the good news that

HKIA has been accepted as a full signatory of Canberra Accord for a period of six years from 2018 to 2024. This means that the outcome through our HKIA/ARB accreditation system are now recognised as substantially equivalent to those of the other signatories of Canberra Accord, which include the national accreditation organisations of China, USA, Canada, South Korea, South Africa, Mexico and Commonwealth Association of Architects. HKIA would continue to work with Architects Registration Board to enhance our accreditation system in line with other signatories.

Architects Regional Council Asia (ARCASIA) 18th Asia Congress of Architects (ACA18) and Union of Architects (UIA) Region IV Meeting

I attended various meetings and Congress events at ACA18 together with a team of HKIA delegates in September 2018 in Tokyo, Japan. The UIA Region IV Meeting was held as a collateral event as well. There were a lot of experience sharing, with fruitful exchanges on issues in Architectural Education, Professional Practice, Green and Sustainable Architecture as well as for the development of Young Architects. In view of the Belt and Road Initiatives, there shall be increasing opportunities for regional communications and cross border collaborations among ARCASIA countries and economies.

Connecting with Members

HKIA Sports and Family Day 2018

The HKIA Sports and Family Day 2018 was successfully held on 28 April 2018 at the Stanley Ho Sports Centre, The University of Hong Kong. More than 200 members with their family participated in

this sports gala and took part in various races. It was an unforgettable day filled with fun and laughter.

Proposed Amendment to HKIA Rules concerning Honorary Fellow(s) and Honorary Member(s)

According to The Rules of The Institute (Rules), HKIA could confer Honorary Fellowship (HF) or Honorary Membership (HM) to such persons as the Institute may wish to honour. In recent years, there had been increasing queries from members about the definition of HF and HM. After reviewing the aforesaid Rules under the current context, the Council was of the view that both HF and HM deserve equal recognition. After discussion at the Members' Forum and voting at the Third Quarterly General Meeting in September 2018, the proposed amendment to HKIA Rules was adopted.

HKIA Annual Ball 2018

The HKIA Annual Ball on 3 November 2018 was an enjoyable evening well attended by about 480 distinguished guests and members. We were pleased to have Mrs. Carrie Lam, Chief Executive of the HKSAR as our Guest of Honours. Handover of the Presidential emblem to President-elect Mr. Felix Li, conferment of HKIA Honorary Fellows and the prize presentation to the HKIA Annual Awards 2017/18 winners, Young Architect Award 2017 and Student Medals 2018 were made at the same occasion.

Communications with the Industry

Forum on Quality for Construction Industry and Launch of Construction Innovation and Technology Fund

I was invited by Development Bureau (DevB) and Construction Industry Council (CIC) to participate in the Forum on Quality for Construction Industry as a panelist on 2 October 2018. To encourage wider adoption of innovative constructive methods such as prefabrication / Modular Integrated Construction and Building Information Modelling (BIM) and to reinforce DevB's initiatives for quality enhancement in "Construction 2.0", the Construction Innovation and Technology Fund (CITF) was officially launched – a total of HK\$1 billion funding was allocated to cover two aspects, namely technology adoption and manpower development.

Grand Opening of Hong Kong Institute of Construction (HKIC) and Modular Integrated Construction (MiC) Display Centre

The construction industry in Hong Kong has entered a new era with the establishment of Hong Kong Institute of Construction (HKIC) and Modular Integrated Construction (MiC) Display Centre by CIC. HKIC was opened in October 2018 with the aim to nurture an accomplished construction workforce with sound professional skills, theoretical knowledge and innovative ideas. The MiC Centre opened in November 2018 consists of ten modular units to showcase five residential units for different

occupancy. Currently MiC has also been adopted in several public projects to enhance site safety and construction quality. The new workforce and technology would be pivotal to our future construction industry.

For the past 2 years, I am privileged to have come across so many learned seniors, passionate colleagues and enthusiastic friends along the way. With the collective efforts, a number of new initiatives and collaborations just happened amazingly, which I could not have anticipated at the start of my presidency.

Finally, my sincere appreciation must go to our Council, Boards, Committees and all the members for your support, hard work and contributions for the past two years in 2017 and 2018.

Practices Matters

- Proposed Security of Payment Legislation (SOPL)
 - HKIA met Development Bureau (DEVB) to discuss the default adjudicator nomination procedure and formation of Adjudicator Nominating Body (ANB) and adjudication of time-related disputes under SOPL on 12 November 2017.
 - In reply to the letter of DEVB dated 22 January 2018 regarding the draft proposal on register of ANB, HKIA, AAP, HKIS and ACQS issued a joint enquiry letter dated 7 March 2018 to DEVB enquiring the draft proposal.
 - Regarding the proposal of excluding the adjudication of the decision on Extension of Time claim from SOPL, HKIA, AAP, HKIS and ACQS issued a joint letter dated 7 March 2018 to DEVB to further pursue the discussion with DEVB on excluding from SOPL adjudication the decision on Extension of Time claim. HKIA, HKIS, AAP and ACQS also met Development Bureau on 10 April 2018 and sent a joint letter to DEVB to further pursue the discussion with DEVB on 13 April 2018.
 - A series of briefing sessions was held by DEVB to brief the industry stakeholders regarding the draft SOP Bill. HKIA attended the first 3 sessions held in the period from late March to April 2018.

Honorary Secretary's Report

However, DEVB cancelled the rest of the 4 sessions scheduled for the period between late April 2018 and June 2018.

- HKIA invited DEVB to give a briefing to HKIA members on draft SOP Bill. DEVB advised that the briefing would be held after the industry briefing sessions had completed.
- A circular was issued to all members and all registered practices to update on the background and key issues of SOPL as well as the actions ahead on 3 May 2018.
- Building Information Modelling (BIM)
 - HKIA conducted a survey among all registered practices to collect information regarding experience and readiness on BIM adoption in January 2018.
 - Further to the meeting with DEVB in November 2017 and the survey issued to all RPs regarding their experience and readiness on BIM adoption, a letter was issued to DEVB to make suggestions on BIM implementation details on 22 March 2018.
 - HKIA BIM Accreditation Programme
The taskforce was inviting members with BIM experience to serve as interviewer in the accreditation programme.
 - BIM Contract Conditions
HKIA accepted the invitation of HKIS to join the BIM Contract Alliance to review the proposed BIM Contract Conditions for construction industry. Comments to the draft were reflected to HKIS on 5 October 2018. The discussion was ongoing by the Alliance.

- CPD Seminars / Sharing Sessions

A written submission was delivered to Development Bureau to respond to the proposal concerning the responsibilities of the AACSB consultants for site supervision on 24 October 2018.

• Construction Innovation and Technology Fund (CITF)

- Upon launch of CITF for application on 2 October 2018, the application framework of CITF was circulated to all registered practices and all general members for information.
- A briefing delivered by Construction Industry Council (CIC) was held on 20 November 2018.
- HKIA sent a letter to Steering Committee on CITF regarding eligibility for CITF.

It was confirmed that HKIA is accepted as a system of accreditation/ validation/ recognition that leads to outcomes substantially equivalent to those of the other signatories and the HKIA is transferred from provisional to signatory status for a period of six years, effective 1 January 2018.

A Joint ARB/HKIA taskforce was set up to review the current HKIA/ARB Accreditation Handbook as to comply with the Canberra Accord criteria.

3. Renewal of mutual recognition agreement on accreditation systems with NABAR

The agreement with National Administration Board of Architectural Registration (NABAR) on mutual recognition of each other's accreditation systems of architectural professional degrees was expired in January 2019. Since NBAA and HKIA are now signatories of Canberra Accord, both accreditation systems and accredited programmes are mutually recognised for registration in the Mainland and Hong Kong under the Canberra Accord agreement.

Belt and Road Initiatives and Greater Bay Area Development

In the second year after setting up the Belt&Road and Bay Area Taskforce Committee under BMA, the Committee focused on formulating strategies of HKIA's contribution in the development of Belt and Road Initiatives and the Greater Bay Area.

In view of growing importance of the Greater Bay Area, HKIA representatives reflected and discussed the HKIA wishes about more opportunities for young architects, registration of individual architects and architectural firms in Greater Bay Area on various occasions.

Qianhai Development

Apart from reflecting members' views on the development of Qianhai, in order to attract more Hong Kong young architects and students to get involved in the development of Qianhai, a Qianhai Design Competition which was organized by Qianhai Shenzhen-Hong Kong Modern Service Industry Cooperation Zone of Shenzhen, commissioned by HKIA and Shenzhen Qianhai Development & Investment Holding Co., Ltd, and supported by Department of Educational, Scientific and Technological Affairs of Liaison Office of the Central People's Government in the HKSAR, was organized in the first half of Year 2018.

With extensive promotion including one briefing session and two site visits, the competition attracted 29 submissions from young architects and architectural students in Hong Kong.

The result of the competition was announced at the Award Presentation Ceremony held on 30 June 2018 at PMQ. The Jury Panel selected 9 awards in the Young Architect Professional Category and 4 awards in the Student Category.

Deed of Constitution

WE, THE UNDERSIGNED being met together on the third day of September in the year one thousand nine hundred and fifty-six and being desirous of forming a Society in the Colony of Hong Kong for the general advancement of Civil Architecture and for promoting and facilitating the acquirement of the knowledge of the various Arts and Sciences connected therewith DO HEREBY BAND OURSELVES TOGETHER IN A SOCIETY TO BE KNOWN AS THE HONG KONG SOCIETY OF ARCHITECTS and do undertake as Foundation Members to subscribe to the funds and be bound by the Rules of the Society AND DO FURTHER DECLARE AND AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. that the Society shall consist of Members, Honorary Members, Associates, Graduates and Students;
 2. that the Society shall elect and be governed by a Council consisting of a President, two Vice-Presidents, and such other Officers and Members of Council as it may decide;
 3. that the Society shall make such Rules for its own good governance and the conduct of its members as it may from time to time think fit;
 4. that the Society shall have power in its corporate name to acquire, hold and dispose of property and funds and shall to this end comply with Ordinances of the Government of Hong Kong;
 5. that the Society shall invite and have as its Patron a person of eminence in colony.

Historical Note

Formation

On 3rd September, 1956, 27 architects gathered and formed a Society “for the general advancement of Civil Architecture and for promoting and facilitating the acquirement of the knowledge of the various Arts and Sciences.” Thus The Hong Kong Society of Architects was formed. On 7th May, 1957, the first amendments were made, to stand for over two and a half years. During this period the membership of the Society increased by 50% and recognition as an Allied Society was given by Royal Institute of British Architects. In accord with this growth further amendments were made to come into effect on 3rd November, 1959. By the end of 1962, the Society expanded to a membership seven times as large as that first body of foundation members.

The changes of name from Society to the Institute was effected in 1972 after a great deal of preparatory work, and has initiated a new phase of activity in the Institute’s affairs. Members will use the professional affix – Architect HKIA and describe themselves as Member of The Hong Kong Institute of Architects. Associates will describe themselves as Associate of The Hong Kong Institute of Architects in full. No abbreviation of this is permitted.

Purpose

The two main purposes of the Institute are to continue to raise both the standard of

architecture in Hong Kong and the standard of professional services offered by its members.

Code of Professional Conduct

In addition to the responsibilities of architects as professionals under law, members of the institute are governed by a Code of Professional Conduct. This Code aims to provide the standard of professional conduct and self-discipline required of the members of the Institute in the interest the general public.

Discipline

A member whose conduct is found to be in contravention of the Code or dishonouring the principle of the Code is liable to reprimand, suspension or expulsion. This ensures that the public receives from HKIA members only the highest standard of professional service.

Service to the Public

The Institute also serves the public by applying the collective expertise of its members in an advisory role to government and to the building industry. Today, HKIA is represented in numerous consultative or advisory bodies ranging from a working group which counsels the drafting of new building and planning legislation to a committee which formulates standard contracts for use in the building industry.

Historical Note

Architectural Education

In the field of education, the Institute works closely with the two Universities, namely, the University of Hong Kong and the Chinese University of Hong Kong and offers courses and counsel in professional practice and practical experience in architecture.

Professional Qualification

Every year, candidates aspiring to the professional qualification of Architect sit a professional examination held by the Institute. Successful candidates receive recognition not only from professional bodies in Hong Kong but also in UK, Australia, Canada, USA and other countries.

International Participation

In recent years, the Institute takes Hong Kong to the fore in international circles through its active participation in the International Union of Architects (UIA), the Commonwealth Association of Architects (CAA), and the Architects Regional Council of Asia (ARCASIA).

Organization

Today, The Hong Kong Institute of Architects has around 180 Fellows, more than 3,000 Members and over 600 Associates and Graduate Members. The Institute is governed by a Council consisting of a President, two Vice-Presidents, an Honorary Secretary, an

Honorary Treasurer, eight Ordinary Members of the Council, the Immediate Past President (ex-officio member) and the Chairmen of the Boards. The Boards, appointed by the Council, are formed to deal with specific areas in the objectives of the Institute. They are the Board of Educational Affairs, Board of External Affairs, Board of Internal Affairs, Board of Local Affairs, Board of Practices and Board of Mainland Affairs. These Boards in turn appoint Committees to deal with matters within the area of responsibility of the Boards.
