INTRODUCTION

The booming economies in the Cross-Strait regions and the Greater Bay Area have brought unprecedented challenges as well as opportunities for architectural designs, and also promoted the harmonious coexistence of technology, ecology, and humanities.

The HKIA Cross-Strait Architectural Design Awards 2024 aims to celebrate and recognize architectural design excellence that contributes to better living, economic advancement, social harmony, cultural identity and the building of a body of knowledge through innovation and creativity. It is also conceived as a vital platform to stimulate professional interaction in the Cross-Strait regions through discussion and learning from each others, which in turn facilitates the elevation of architectural designs in the Cross-Strait regions towards the international arena.

- (A) Residential
- (B) Commercial (Office / Hotel)
- (C) Commercial (Shopping)
- (D) Community, Culture & Recreational Projects
- (E) Education & Religious Projects
- (F) Transport & Infrastructure Facilities
- (G) Architecture for Social Innovation
- (H) Un-built Projects: Architectural Design Scheme

2.2 Awards

For Categories (A) to (H):

Awards will comprise up to ONE Gold Award, TWO Silver Awards and FOUR Merit Awards for each category.

R U L E S & REQUIREMENTS

4.1 Eligibility

- The participating project can be located in Mainland China, Taiwan, Macau, Hong Kong or any international regions, but must be completed in the **past ten years**.
- The participating project shall not be in any way associated with members of the Jury Panel.
- New buildings as well as restored, rehabilitated and converted buildings are eligible for participation.
- For Categories (A) to (G), all participating buildings or projects should be completed between 3 August 2014 and 2 August 2024 (i.e. with occupation permit or completion certificate issued or equivalent; or the building has been handed over to the owner for occupation in the period).
- For Category (H), unbuilt projects are eligible for participation upon official appointment by the owner with authorization.
- Projects awarded Gold Award / Silver Awards / Merit Award in previous CADAs are not eligible for CADA 2024.
- The design team for each participating project must be headed by an architect in Mainland China, Taiwan, Macau or Hong Kong. Please state in the submission that the award, if any, should be presented to the architectural practice or the head architect.
- HKIA Members can use the same submission to apply for this year's HKIA Annual Award. Please state in the nomination form.

Notes:

- The Institute reserves the right not to make an award if the Jury Panel considers no participating project is worthy of an award.
- ii) The decision of the Jury Panel shall be final.

4.2 Nomination

- The participant should apply by completing the attached Nomination Form together with all necessary documents
- The participant shall indicate in Item 6 of the Nomination Form [Form 1], the building category of the submitted project. The entries will be grouped under different categories of building types for assessment.
- In case of doubt about the building type of a particular submission, the decision of the Organizing Committee shall be final.
- The same project can participate in more than one category, but a separate nomination form and nomination fee should be submitted for each additional category.

4.4 Submission

- The submission, together with necessary documents, must reach the CADA Secretariat on or before 12:00pm (noon) on Friday, 2 August 2024 through online form [Hong Kong Time]:-

- Necessary Documents include:
 - (1) Checklist [Form 0]
 - (2) Nomination Form [Form 1]
 - (3) Duly signed Fact Sheet [Form 2], including a summary (bi-lingual, in no more than 150 words) and design statement (bi-lingual, in no more than 500 words). No company names, logos or other identifying information may appear in the design statement.
 - (4) Payment cheque / Alipay screen cap /
 Receipt of Telegraphic Transfer (receipt of TT could be submitted later, after getting the Awards Reference Number)
 - (5) For Categories (A)-(G), Copy of Occupation Permit / Proof of Building Completion
 - Completion Permit issued by the Government or Completion
 Certificate issued by the Architect or hand-over certification by the
 owner or equivalent is acceptable.

(6) Project presentation document and images:

- a. A PPT document in landscape format of max. 15 pages to present the entry project. (This will also be used later for on-screen presentation to the Jury Panel and for Jury Panel's stage 1 and stage 2 assessment.) A PDF version of the same document should be provided as well.
 - All texts shall be in both English and Chinese.
 - NO company names, logos or other identifying information are allowed to appear on the PPT/PDF. (Disqualification may be resulted otherwise.)
 - No advertisement or commercial content should appear on the presentation.
 - Location plan, floor plans and sections, photos of the projects are recommended to be shown in the presentation.
 - Submitted images should accurately portray the building. Over-edited or doctored photos, for example, altering the building profile, omitting elements which should be seen on the façade, altering the actual site context etc., are prohibited. Disqualification may be resulted otherwise.
- b. 4 key images of the participating project, of the following specifications:
 - In ".jpg" format.

- Image resolution not less than 3000 pixels on the long side
- Submitted images should accurately portray the building. Over-edited or doctored photos, for example, altering the building profile, omitting elements which should be seen on the façade, altering the actual site context, etc., are prohibited. Disqualification may be resulted.
- c. All shortlisted entries will be required to submit ONE A0 size panel in digital format (both JPG & PDF formats) for the exhibition purpose.
- d. For multiple entries made by the same architectural practice, separate submissions with all documents listed above should be submitted.
- e. No printed images or presentation document will be accepted unless specifically requested by the Jury Panel later.
- The onus is on the participant to ensure that his submission is received by the Chief Operating Officer of HKIA before the closing date and time of submission.
- No consideration would be given to late submissions.
- 4.5 Format of One Single Electronic Presentation Board for short-listed submissions in Stage II of the Jury Process (digital format .jpeg & .pdf, no hardcopy is required) (for Category (A) to (H) only)
 - Specifications
 - The size of the e-Presentation Board design submitted for each submission shall be in one single A0 size (portrait orientation) [841mm (w) x 1189mm (h)] (no production is required)
 - ii) All texts shall be in both Chinese and English.
 - iii) Resolution should be 300dpi minimum
 - iv) No company names, logo or other identifying information may appear on any submission materials

■ Contents

- No advertisement or commercial content shall appear on the presentation board.
- ii) The following information is recommended to appear on the board:
 - Written description of the project
 - Location Plan
 - · Floor plans and sections of the project
 - Photos of the projects, including 4 images of the building showing different perspectives for all entry categories
- (iii) The extent of the photos and drawings to be included are at the discretion of the participant, but the information included should be sufficient to enable the Jury Panel to assess the design merit of the building.

TERMS & CONDITIONS

5.1 Examination for Eligibility of Submissions

The Design Awards Organizing Committee may exclude any submission from consideration by the Jury if the submission does not fully conform to the Rules & Requirements stated herein. Any such exclusion by the Organizing Committee shall be final and such submissions will not be included in the Exhibition and Publication.

All submissions will be examined and the works achieved the expected standards of the Award programme will be shortlisted to enter final assessment for Awards by the Jury Panel. Other than those screen-off submissions in Stage I, all selected projects in Stage II will be invited for Exhibition and Publication.

5.2 Ownership of the Submissions

All submitted materials including forms, electronic files and photographs are deemed to be the property of HKIA and there are no restrictions or losses recoverable from the Institute on the publication and exhibition of any material submitted herewith. The Institute reserves the right to reproduce, print, publish, edit the material submitted in either paper or electronic format or the like, for any use.

The Organizing Committee has the discretion to exclude entries from Exhibition & Publication of the Awards.

5.3 Return of Submission

All submissions will not be returned. Request for retrieval of materials from the Institute after the submission will not be entertained. Therefore, entrants are advised to produce a duplicate set of materials for their own record.

5.4 Disclaimer

Participant must warrant that the information provided in the submission is true and accurate, and agree to abide by the Terms and Conditions stated in this Nomination Brief. All participating parties and clients involved in the project should have been noticed and consented to the submission. HKIA is authorized to publish and exhibit the information without verification. Participant shall also indemnify HKIA or its members and staff for any loss or damages resulted from such publication and exhibition.

JURY PANEL & ASSESSMENT CRITERIA

- **6.1** The international Jury Panel appointed by HKIA is consisted of 4 jury members:
 - i) Ar Natalie Mossin (Head of Institute at the Royal Danish Academy – Institute of Architecture and Technology)
 - ii) Ar. Gonca Pasolar (Managing Partner of EAA-Emre Arolat Architecture)
 - iii) Ar. Ho Tzu Yin (Managing Director of LAUD Architects, Singapore)
 - iv) Prof Prasad Shetty
 (Founder member of School of Environment and Architecture, University of Mumbai)

6.2 Assessment Criteria

- Outstanding architectural design that can stimulate, engage and move the receivers.
- (ii) Excellently addressing the function requirement, providing interesting spatial quality and demonstrating tectonic reasonableness.
- (iii) Having a clear design vision and being successfully demonstrated in the design.
- (iv) Achieving a space for imagination and the pursuit of human wellness.
- (v) Showing innovative ideas to bring the human being' living to a higher level.
- (vi) Responsive to nature and/or urban context of development.
- (vii) Sustainable, adaptive to changes, responsive to the environment, and putting concepts of sustainability and environmental friendliness into practice.
- (viii)Optimal use of land resources without compromising architectural quality.
- (ix) Execution of the architectural details through the architect's skill to bring out the architect's original and creative design intention.
- (x) Demonstrating skill, sensitivity and thoughtfulness in re-interpretation, restoration or adaptive re-use of historically meaningful & significant building or space.
- xi) Innovative ideas of spatial design arrangement.
- xii) Impressive natural lighting/ artificial lighting effect.
- xiii) Excellent choice and use of materials.
- xiv) Sustainable Architecture: Good integration of architectural and sustainable design, smart and clever use of natural resources such as ventilation, daylight, water, etc., achieving genuine energy reduction and a quality living environment by a sensible architectural design approach, optimal use of material to reflect the best intention of the architects on saving the scarce material of the Earth, and demonstrating the importance of architects' role in sustainable design.
- xv) Additionally for Category (G) Architecture for Social Innovation: Demonstrating that the project has provided opportunities for different users to enjoy, use and experience the building's facilities, showing creativity that meets social needs in a better way than the existing solutions, stating the goal of extending and strengthening civil society by creating positive social impact, improving livelihoods, strengthening neighbourhood bonding,

enhancing social inclusion, promoting sharing economy and global citizenship, etc., able to provide inclusive universal design for people with physical disability to enjoy freely in the project.

Ar Natalie Mossin

Head of Institute of Architecture and Technology, Royal Danish Academy

Natalie Mossin is a Danish architect. She is Head of Institute at the Royal Danish Academy – Institute of Architecture and Technology and a member of the Board of the Danish Institute of Fire and Security Technology. She was the President of Congress for the UIA World Congress of Architects, 2023, "Sustainable Futures – Leave no one Behind", and is a former President of the Danish Association of Architects and Vice-president of the Union Internationale des Architectes (UIA). Natalie is an experienced innovation specialist, editor and curator. She is a leading voice in setting the agenda for sustainable development in the built environment, at both a strategic and political level. She has extensive experience with capacity building, innovation initiatives as well as operational and strategic leadership. She has authored and edited articles and books including "An Architecture Guide to the UN 17 Sustainable Development Goals, volume 1 and 2", and has been a curator of the Danish Pavilion at the Venice Architecture Biennale (2018). Her most recent book is "Innovation of Nothing – the capabilities needed to lead sustainable change in the built environment" (2023).



Ar. Gonca Pasolar

Managing Partner of EAA-Emre Arolat Architecture

Born in Switzerland, Gonca Pasolar commenced her college studies at METU in Ankara-Turkey, also receiving her graduate degree in the field of Architecture. In 2004, along with Emre Arolat they formed their own practice in Istanbul as EAA-Emre Arolat Architecture. Ever since, her contribution to EAA's presence has been shown in exhibitions and lectures worldwide in addition to her jury duties in various national and international competitions.

Pasolar won many prestigious awards throughout her career and went on to become the Managing Partner of EAA. Upon receiving European Center for Architecture's 40 under 40 award given to outstanding performance in Architecture and Design in 2010, she was also one of the five nominees for AJ's Women Architects of the Year Award in 2015.

She is well known for some of the recent installations of the practice as 'ist-on situations' exhibition at RIBA in London (2015), arch I strata I antioch for the 15th International Architecture Biennale in Venice (2016), 'Contrasts' for the Complements and Dichotomies exhibition of YAI in Miami (2017).

Managing Director of LAUD Architects, Singapore

Ar Ho Tzu Yin is the Managing Director of LAUD Architects, a Singapore-based award-winning architectural firm with a diverse portfolio, ranging from high-rise residential to institutional projects and office towers. LAUD Architects seeks to embody the twin values of community and sustainability in all their projects.

Some of the design awards received by Ar Ho are: The President*s Design Award (the highest design award in Singapore), SIA Architectural Design Award and World Architecture Festival 2016 (Finalist). In 2017, Ar Ho made the Urban Renewal Authority of Singapore's (URA) "List of 20 leading architects under age 45 years" in Singapore.

Ar Ho is also passionate about education of the next generation of architects, and regularly participates as external reviewer, panellist and design studio critiques for National University of Singapore (NUS) College of Design and Engineering (CDE), Singapore University of Technology and Design (SUTD) as well as Singapore Polytechnic. Tzu Yin received his architecture education in NUS and RMIT.

His works include research on contemporary Indian urbanism with focus on architecture, cultural aspects of urban economy, property, entrepreneurial practices, housing, and urban form.
